

He succeeded in writing short stories. Ripling s first prose collection was published in Calcutta in January 1888, a month after his 22nd birthday. Later in 1888 he published six collections of short stories, containing a total of 41 stories, some quite long. 


Stories for Little Children and Adults

In 1907, Ripling. received the Nobel prize in literature" for observation, vivid imagination, maturity of ideas and outstanding talent of the narrator. By this time R. wrote thirteen volumes of stories, four novels, three books of stories for children, several collections of travel notes, essays, newspaper articles and hundreds of poems. In




RUDYARD KIPLING BORN 30 H DEC. 1865 DIED 18 H JAN 1936
