What is a Preposition?

The preposition is a part of speech which denotes the relations between objects and phenomena. Its shows the relations between a noun or a pronoun and other words.

*on, through, behind, for, beneath, against,
beside, over, during, without, abroad,
across, among, against, around, at the end, at
the bottom, between, behind, below, by,
inside, corner, into, via, after, to, about, in,
on, at, since, while, under, over, right, left*

prepositional phrase.

*The baseball player in the white
shirt
hit a homerun.*

Kinds of Prepositions:

Simple prepositions: Prepositions which consists only one word.

e.g. in, on, at, with, against etc.,

Compound prepositions: Prepositions which consists of two or more words.

e.g. instead of, in the middle of, by the side of etc.,
