



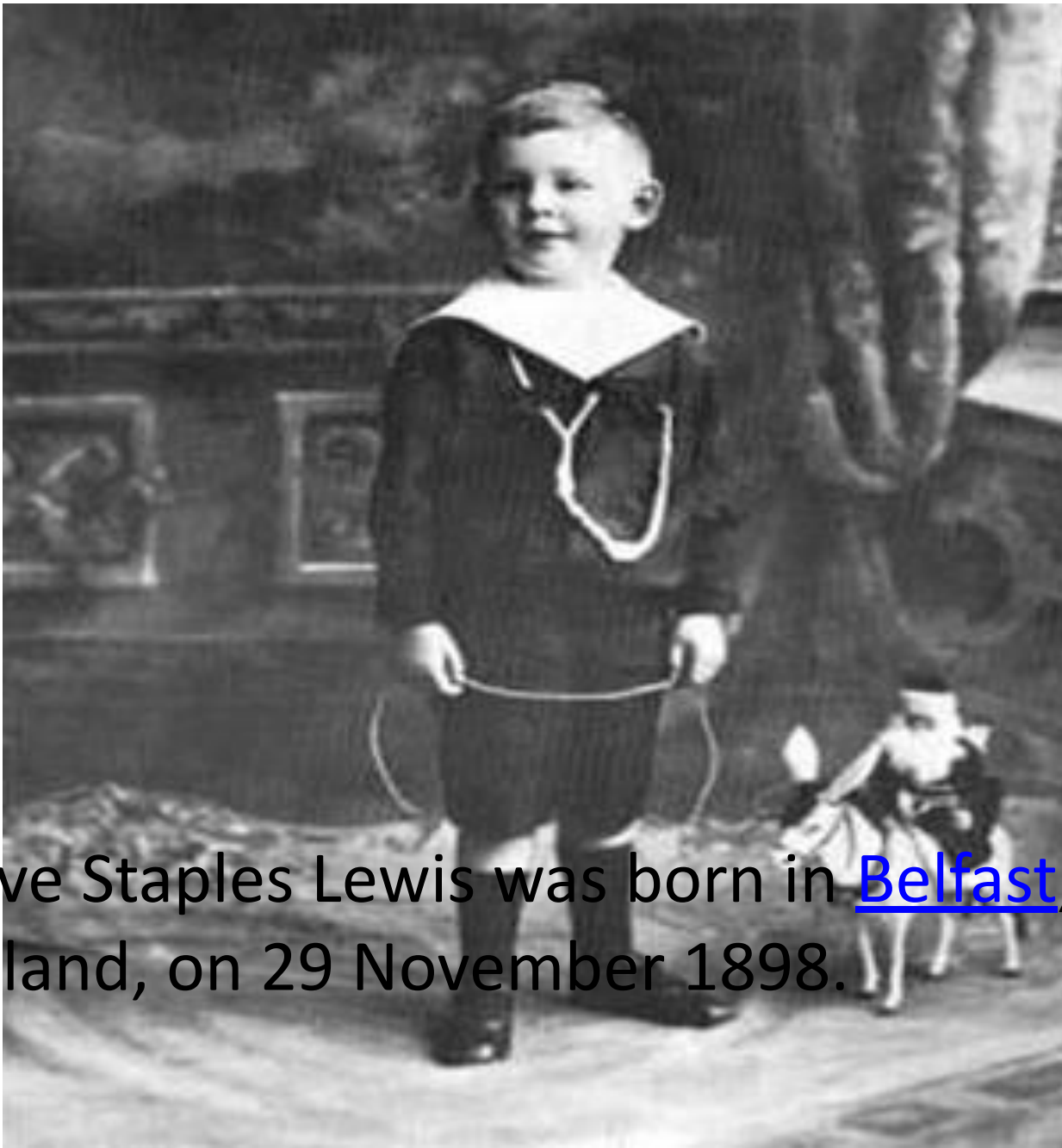

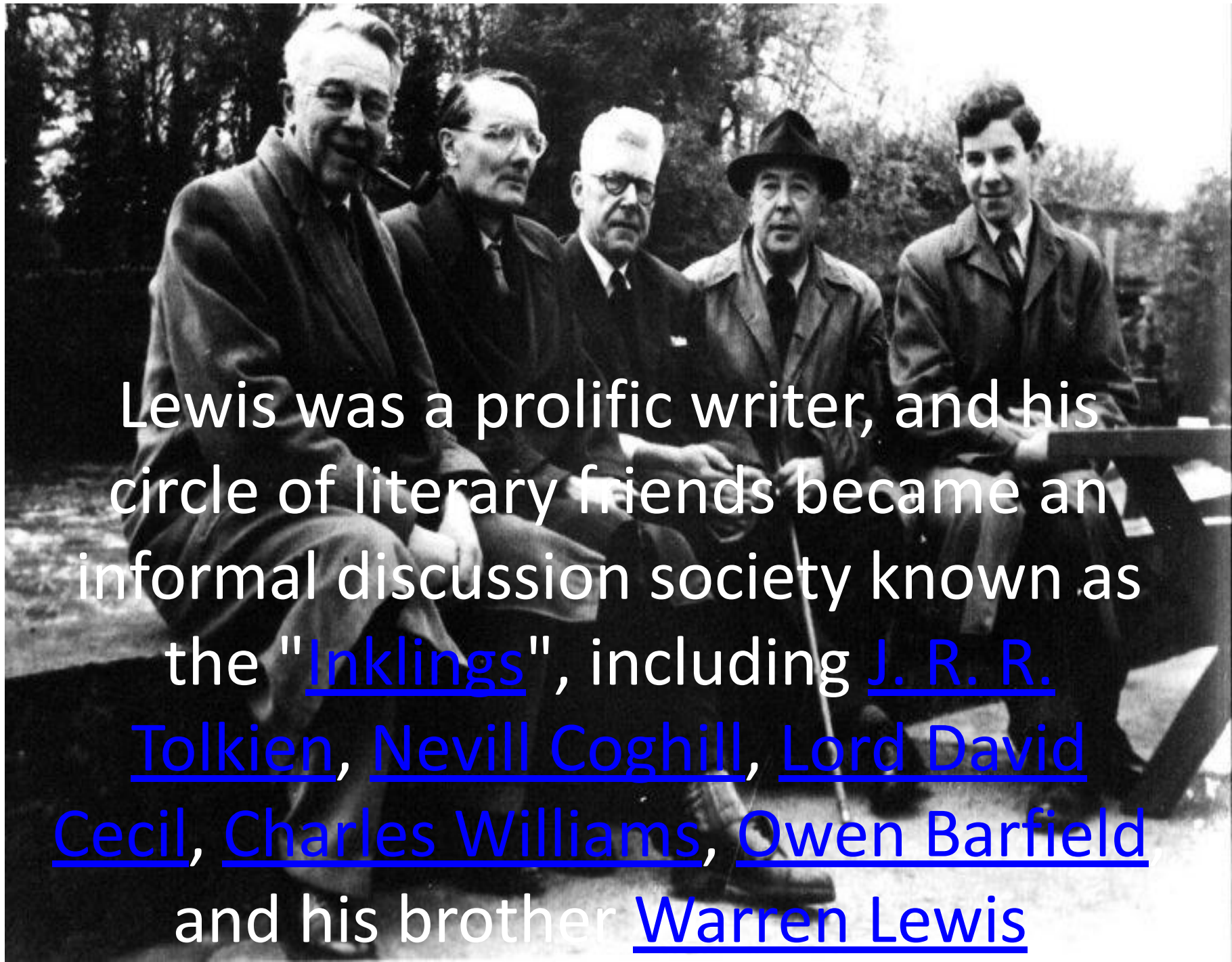

- **Clive Staples Lewis** was a British novelist, poet, academic, [medievalist](#), literary critic, essayist, [lay theologian](#), broadcaster, lecturer, and [Christian apologist](#). He held academic positions at both [Oxford University \(Magdalen College, 1925–1954\)](#) and [Cambridge University \(Magdalene College, 1954–1963\)](#). He is best known for his works of fiction, especially [The Chronicles of Narnia](#)



- Clive Staples Lewis was born in [Belfast](#), Ireland, on 29 November 1898.



Lewis was a prolific writer, and his circle of literary friends became an informal discussion society known as the "Inklings", including J. R. R. Tolkien, Nevill Coghill, Lord David Cecil, Charles Williams, Owen Barfield and his brother Warren Lewis
