- 1930s France and Germany focused on "cultural expansion"
- 1934 the UK established the British Council for Relations with other countries
- 1938 the USA created the Interdepartmental Committee on Cooperation with the Other American Republics and set up the Division of Cultural Relations in the Department State
- Cold war US exchange programs for students and artists
- 1980s culture has been considered as efficient tools of diplomacy
- the Information Age the importance of the international cultural agenda
