

- \Box Born of Thomas and Jemima on June 2nd 1840; in Dorset, England.
- Often ill as a child, he spent most of his time indoors.
- His mother taught him to read and write before the age of four.
- After finishing school, Hardy became employed by an architecture company.
- □ In 1874, he married Emma Gifford.
- Began writing novels and poetry, but was unable to become published.
