hypothetical, imaginary situation in the present/future

<u>If</u> + Past Simp<u>le</u>, <u>wo</u>uld/wouldn't + inf would/wouldn't + in<u>f</u> if + Past Simple

If I didn't have so much work, I'd help you. (but I do, so I can't) I'd help you if I didn't have so much work.

What **would** you **do** if you you **were** a president? (you aren't, but what if you were?)

SECOND CONDITIONAL

If + Past Simple, might +inf	would perhaps	If it was sunny today, we might go for a walk.
If + Past Simple, could + inf	would be able to	If I had 1 million dollars, I could travel a lot.
If + Past Simple, would be Ving	unfinished action, which is a probable result of an unreal condition	You wouldn't be smiling if you knew the truth If I spoke Italian, I'd be working in Italy.
If I were you,	advice	If I were you, I'd choose that dress.
