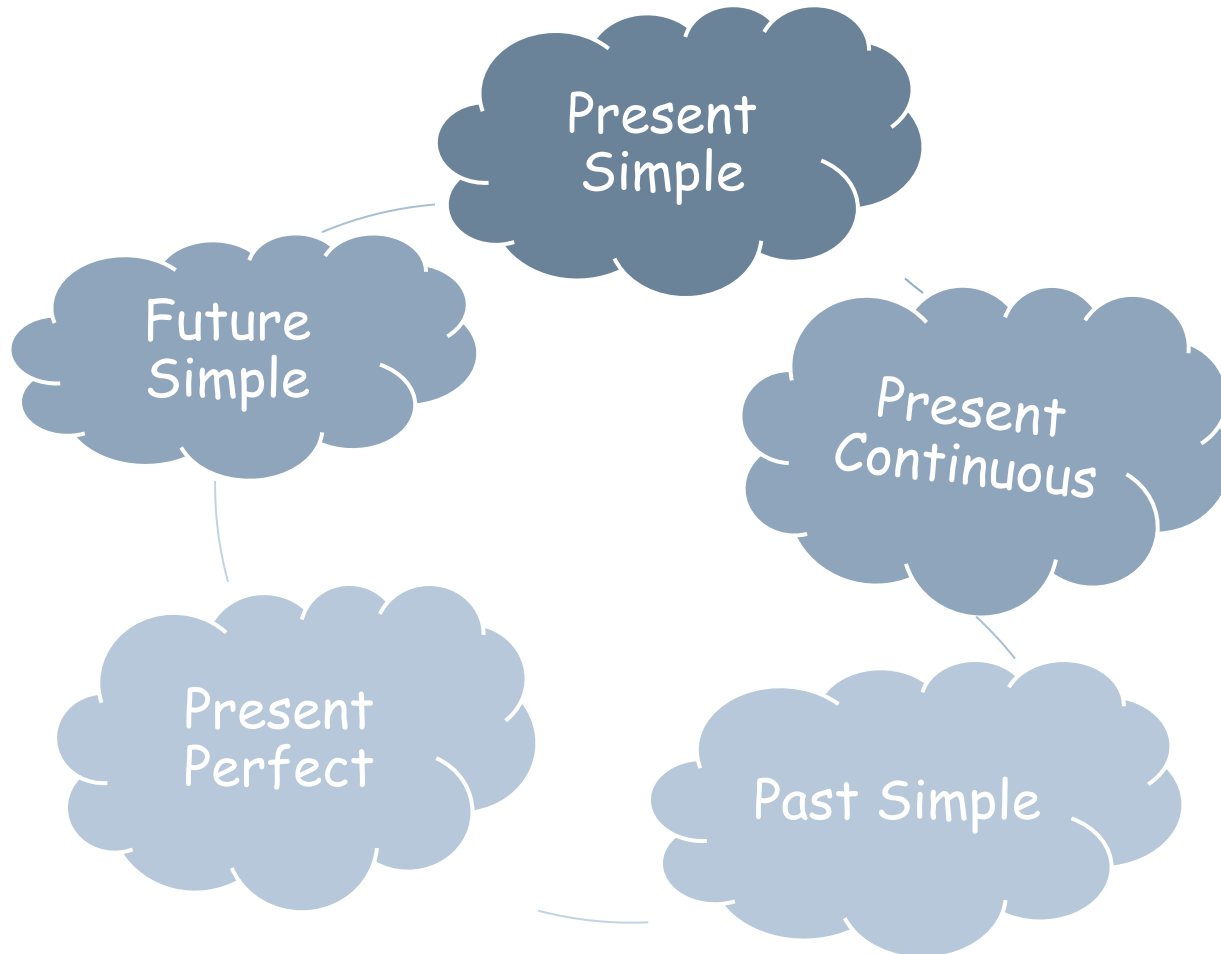

If I study, I will pass my exam.

Present Simple

Future Simple

I will pass my exam if I study.

We use it to talk about possible situations and their consequences in the future.



If you **go** to Rome, you **will**  
**see** the Coliseum



If you **go** to London, may  
be you **will see** the Queen



IF you **make** some money **will**  
**you** come and live with me?

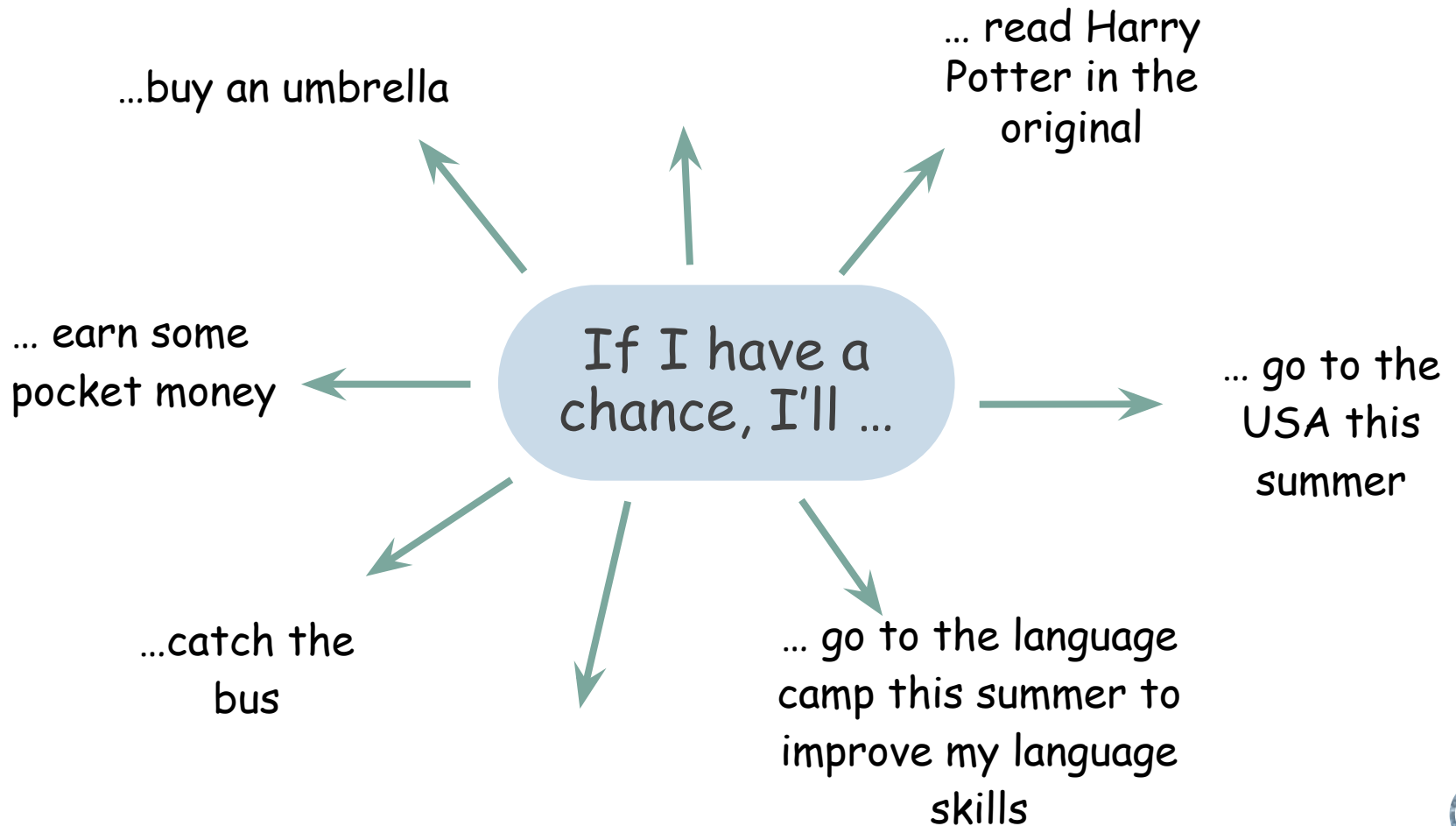


If you **stay** with me you

# "Chain of Events":

- 6.If I show the pictures to my friends, they'll ask their parents to allow them to see the Tower.
- 7. If their parents allow them to visit the Tower, they 'll fly to London.
