- express the likes and dislikes of others.

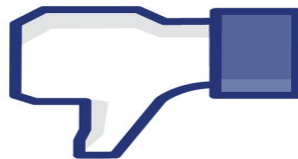
They are used to express that you like or don't like something.

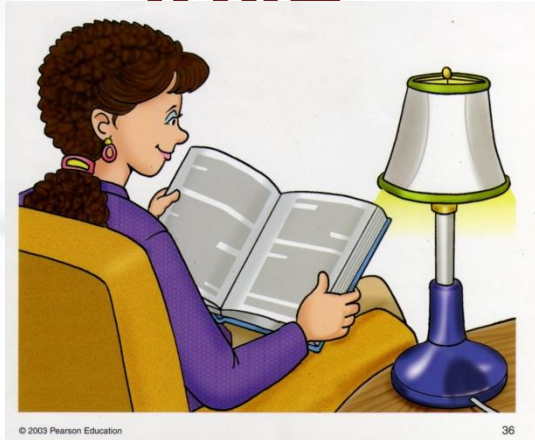

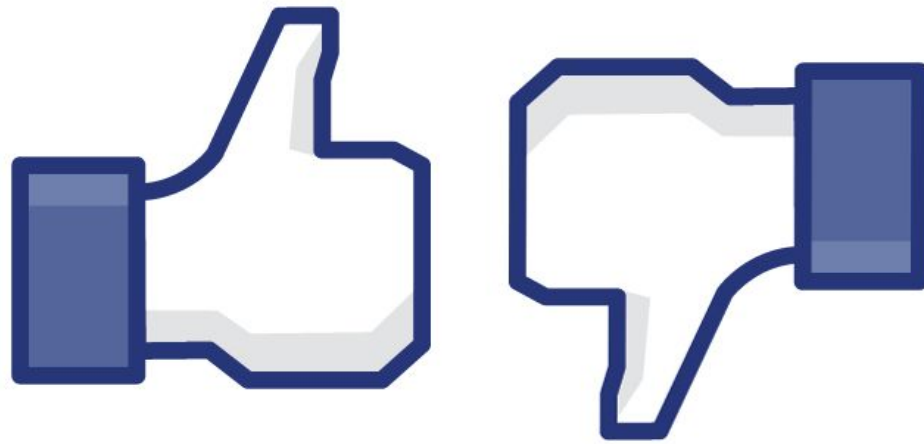

At the end of the class, students will be able to:

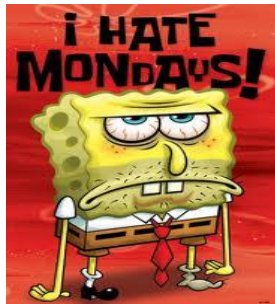
- build sentences using likes and dislikes expressions.
- build sentences using nouns, pronouns and verbs in the –ing form to express likes and dislikes.

These verbs can be followed by a *noun*, *pronoun*,
or a *verb (-ing form)*.

Examples:

*I **hate** Mondays. (noun)

*I **hate** them. (pronoun)



*He **loves** reading.

	Like verb +	Noun
I	love	movies.
They	like	soccer.
Maria	doesn't like	apples.
Carlos	hates	onions.
He	really likes	strawberries.

Pronouns:



Movies > them



Soccer > it



Apples > them



Onions > them



Strawberries > them

Examples:

	Like verb +	Pronoun
I	love	them.(movies)
They	like	it. (soccer)
Maria	doesn't like	them. (apples)
Carlos	hates	them. (onions)
He	really likes	them. (strawberries)

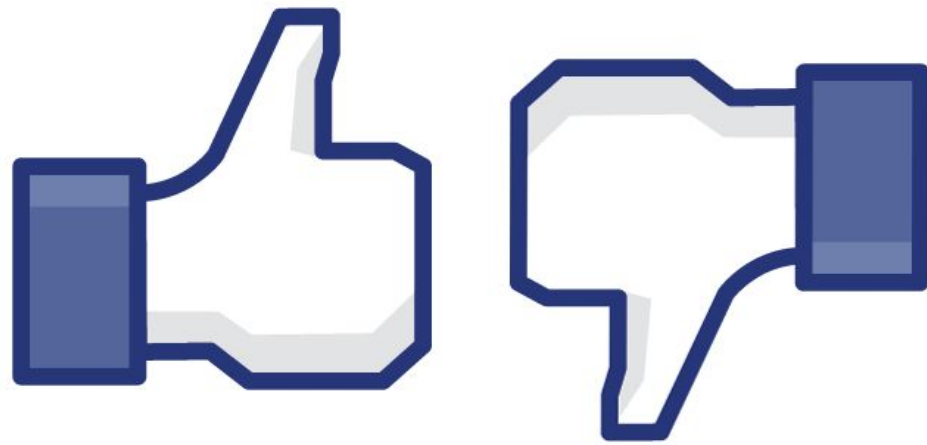

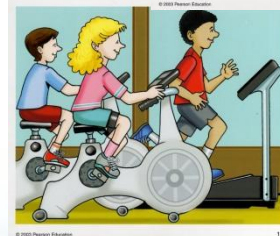
