

**Parents**: Thomas Stevenson.






#### Childhood

# Interest in literature








### Biography of the work


One of the most famous writers, who is often considered the author of one book, the novel Treasure Island, a romantic and youthful work.







#### "The Strange Story of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde"
