Major Industries - finance, communications, international trade, publishing, fashion, communications, farming (fruit and dairy), tourism

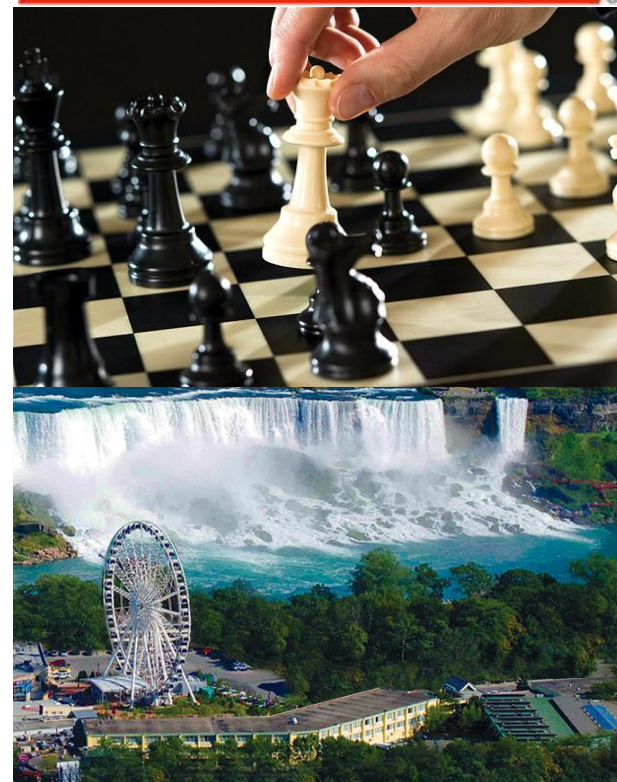

Origin of the Name New York

The English took over of the area that had been called "New Netherland" in 1664, and renamed it New York to honor the Duke of York (York is a city in England).

- New York was the first state to require license plates for cars.
- The “New York Post,” founded in 1803 by Alexander Hamilton, is the oldest running newspaper in the United States.
- The first American chess tournament was held in New York in 1843.
- Niagara Reservation became the first state park in the United States
