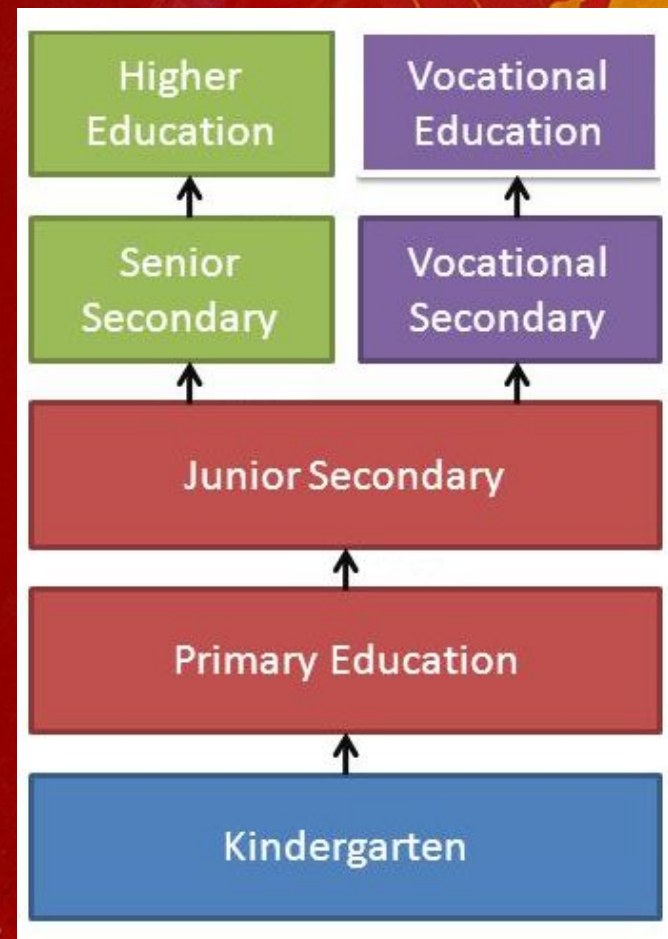
# EDUCATION SYSTEM IN CHINA



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# CHINA EDUCATION SYSTEM

- Kindergarten
- Primary school
- Junior Middle School
- Senior High School  
or Vocational School
- University or College



# PRE-SCHOOL EDUCATION



Pre-school education can last up to three years, with children entering as early as age three until age six.

# PRIMARY EDUCATION



Primary Education last up to six years. The academic year is divided into two semesters. At the end of each semester, there will be examinations.

# JUNIOR SECONDARY



Junior school graduates wishing to continue their education take a locally administered entrance exam, on the basis of which they will have the option either of continuing in an academic upper middle school or of entering a vocational secondary school.

# SENIOR SECONDARY



Also last up to three years, during this time students have to work really hard to pass the National Higher Education Entrance Examination to enter to Higher Education.

# NATIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

National Higher Education Entrance Examination is very important to Chinese students. It usually consists of 4 subjects: Mathematics, Chinese, English and one Optional subject (Chemistry, Physics, Biology, History, Geography...)

# HIGHER EDUCATION

- Bachelor degree: usually 4 years (possibly in other universities 5 years).
- Master degree: usually 2-3 years, depends on universities.
- Doctor 's degree: 2-4 years.
- Post doctorate: minimum 2 years.



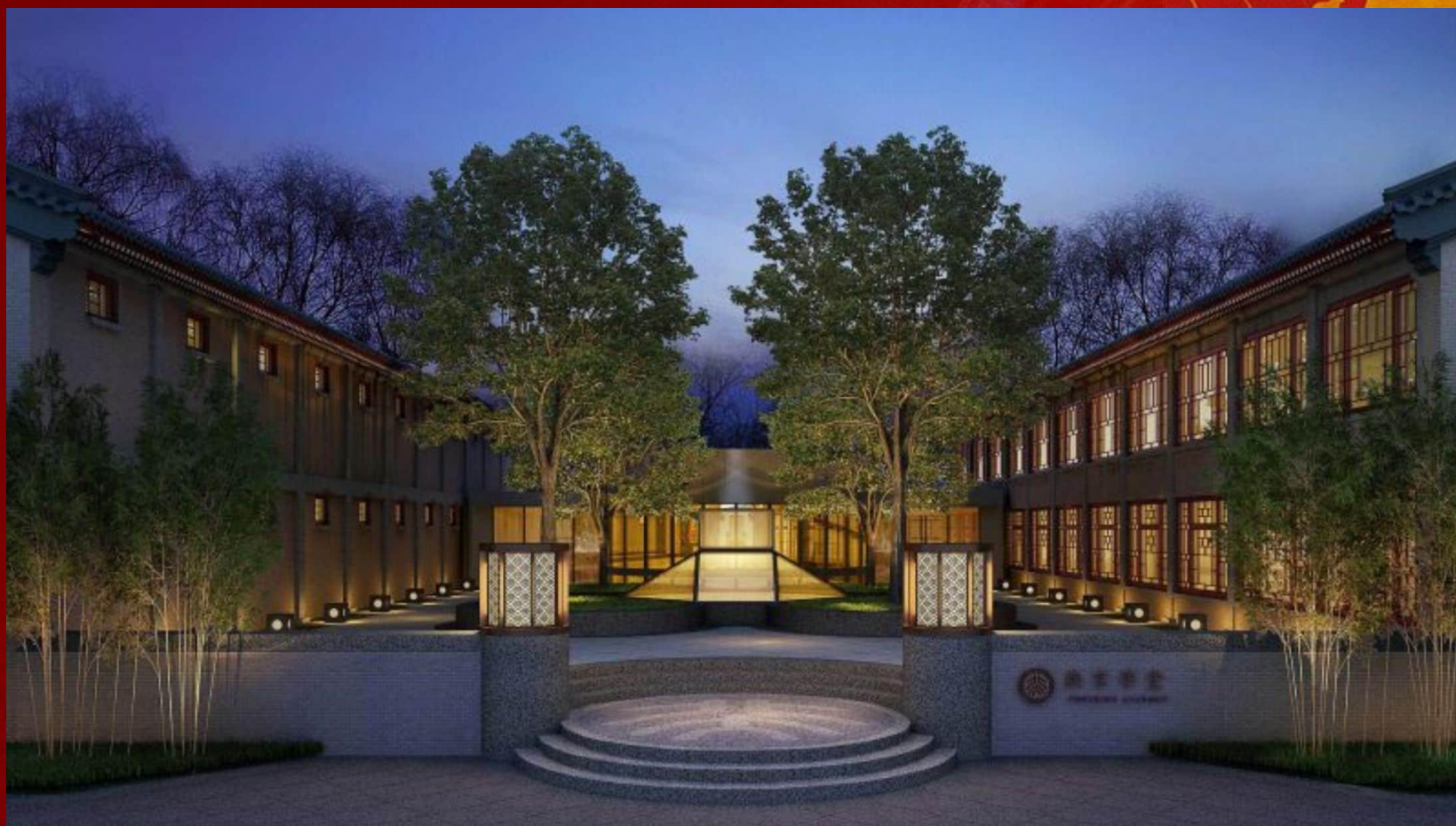
