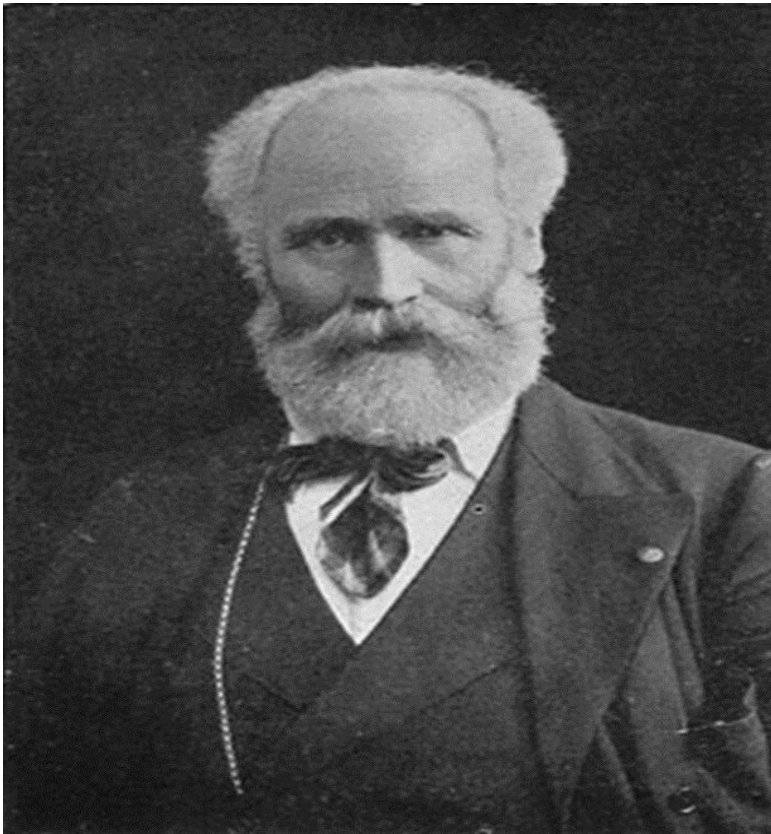

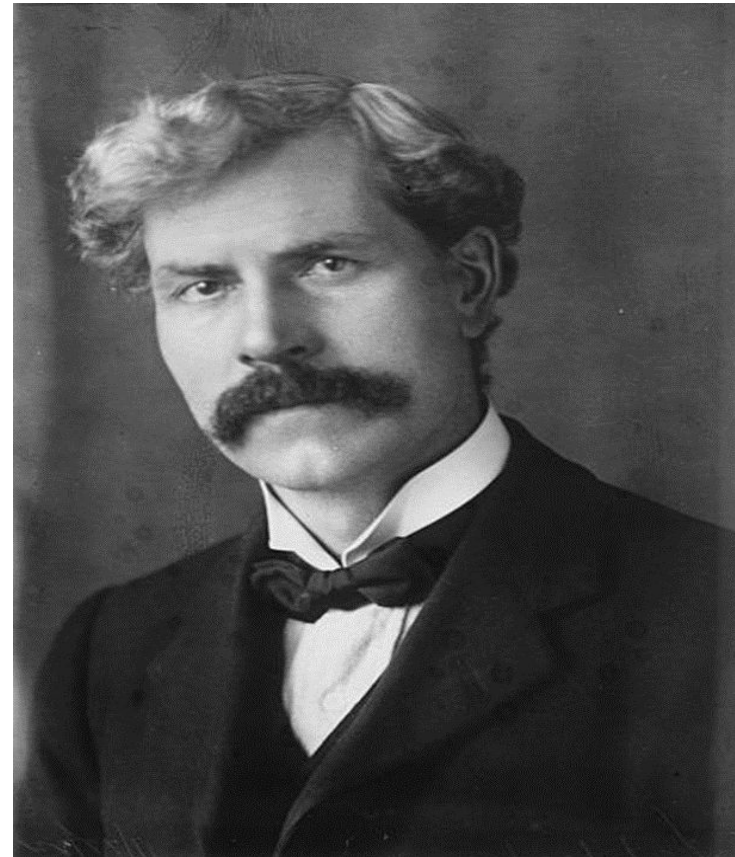

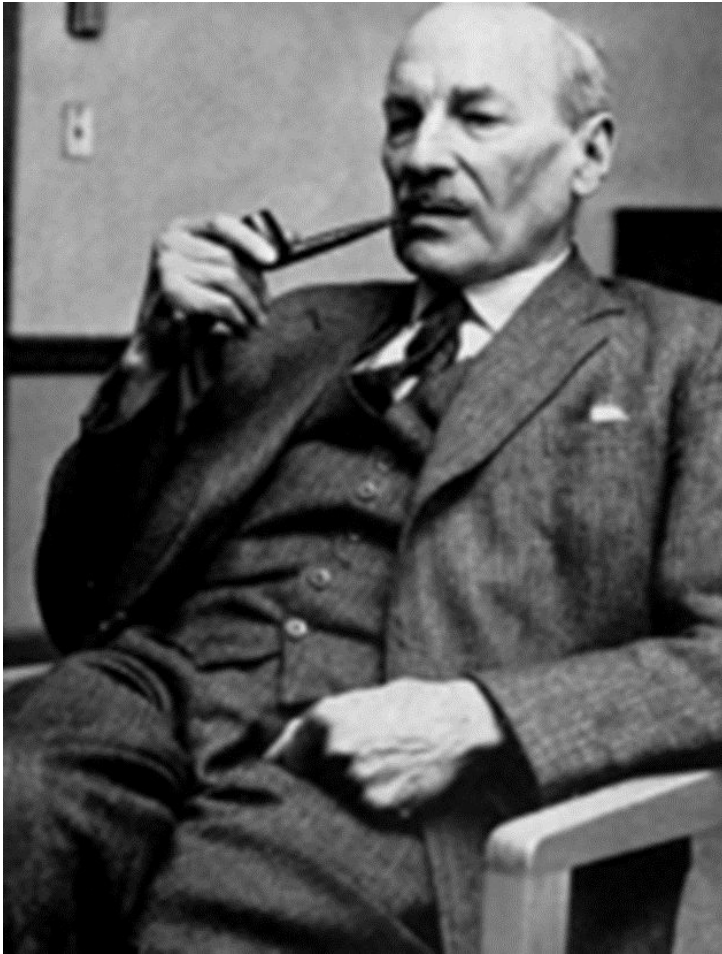




The original "Liberty" logo, in use until

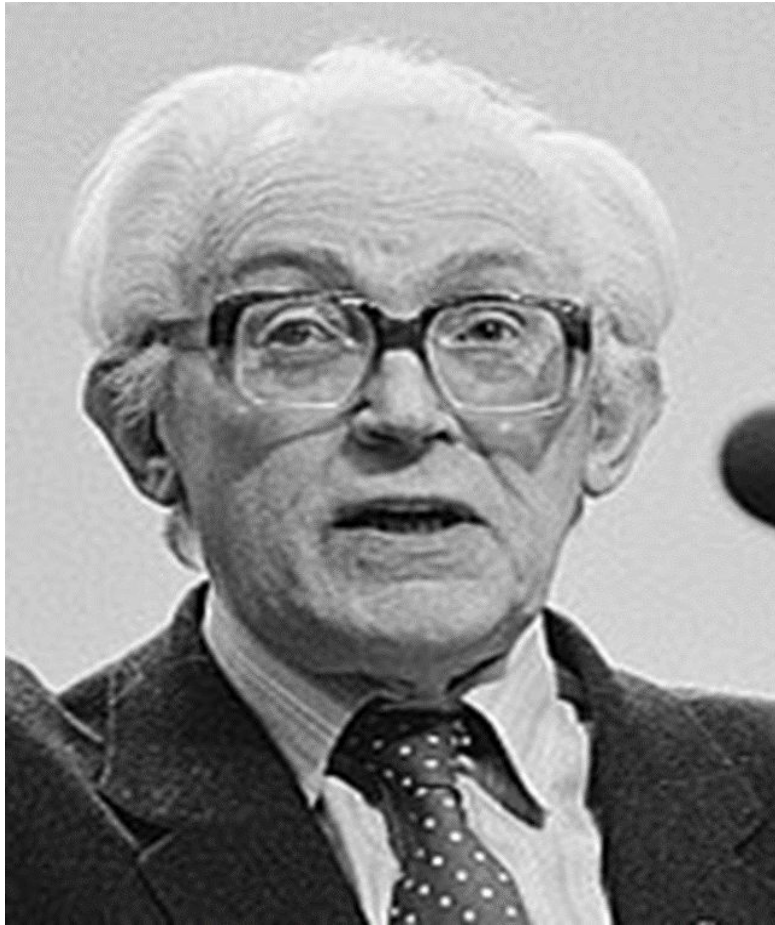

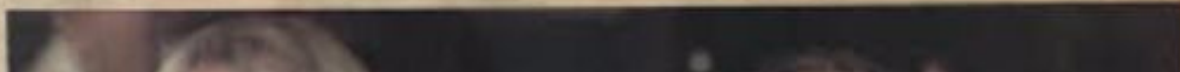

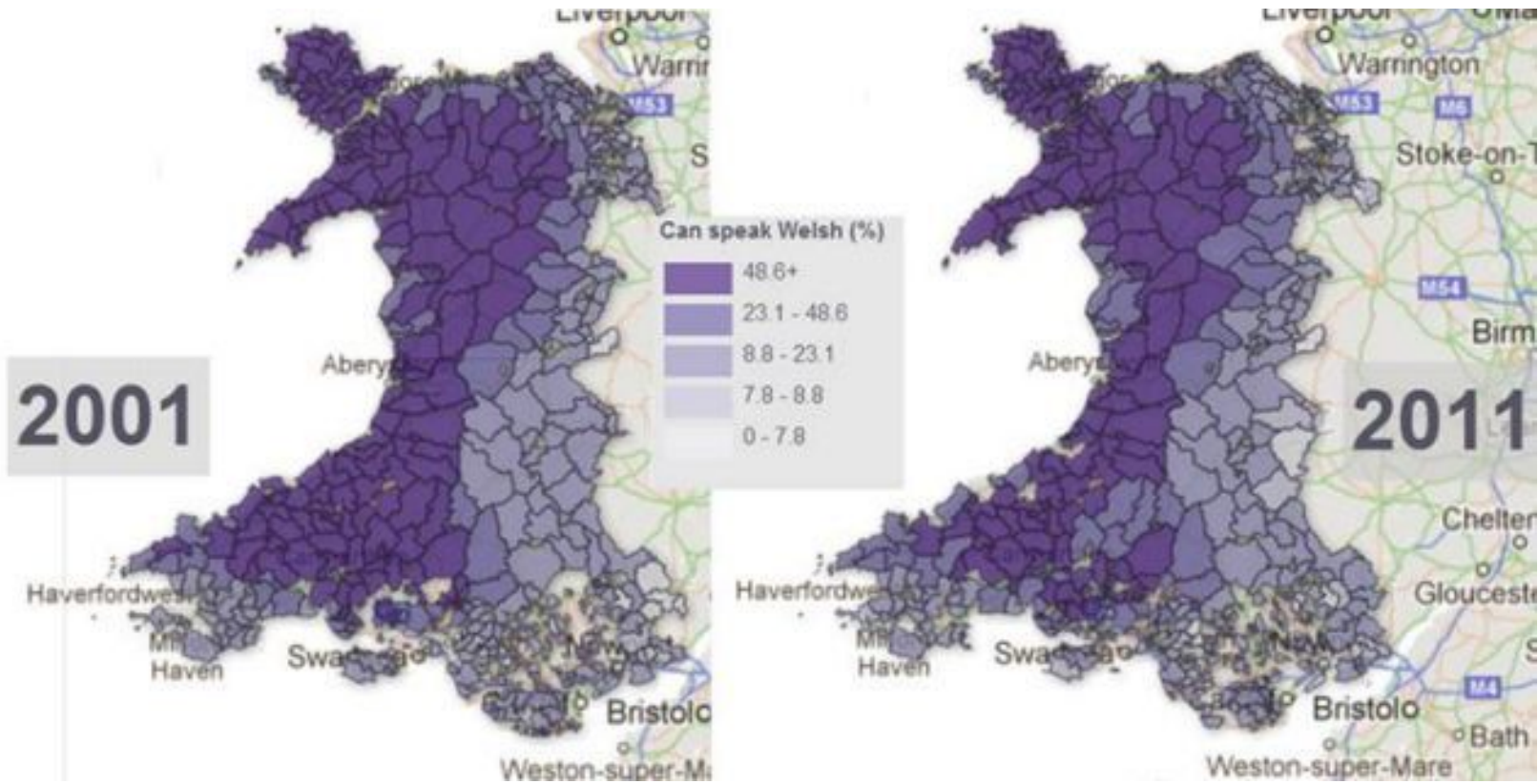

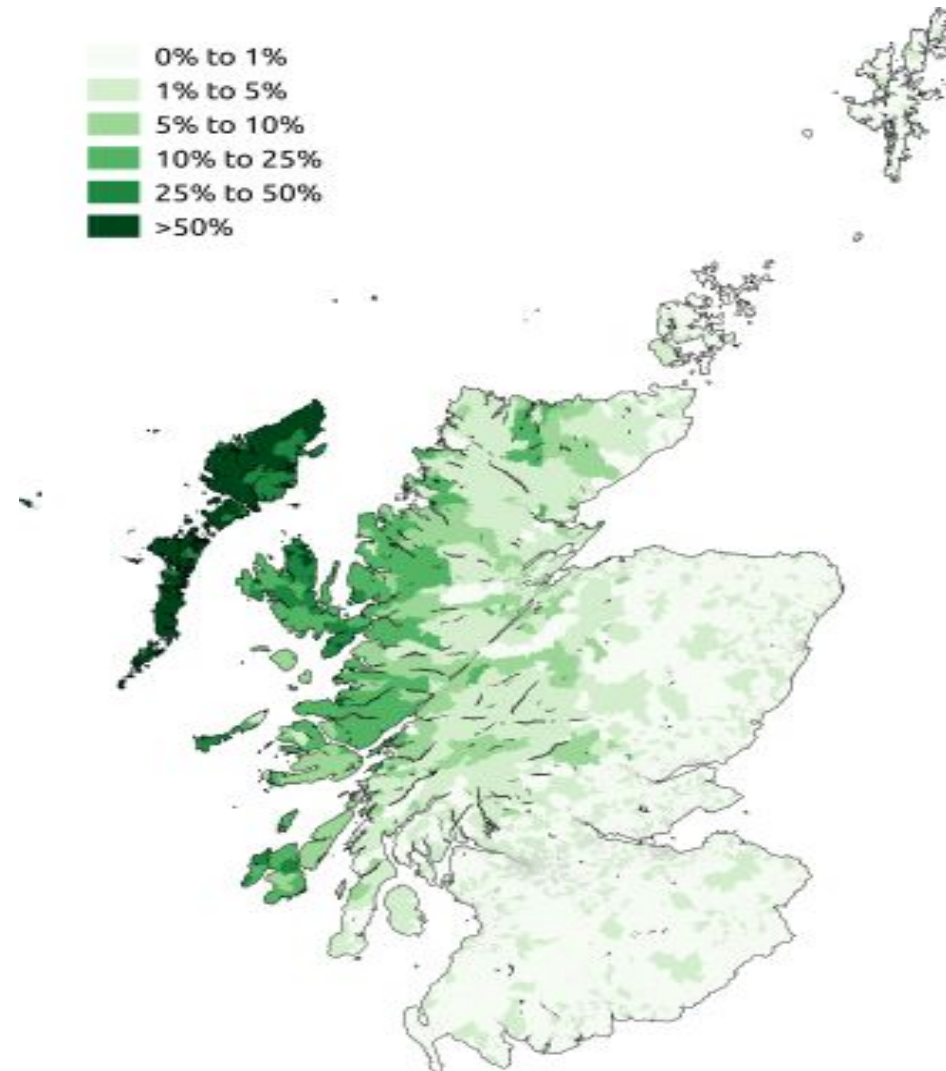
