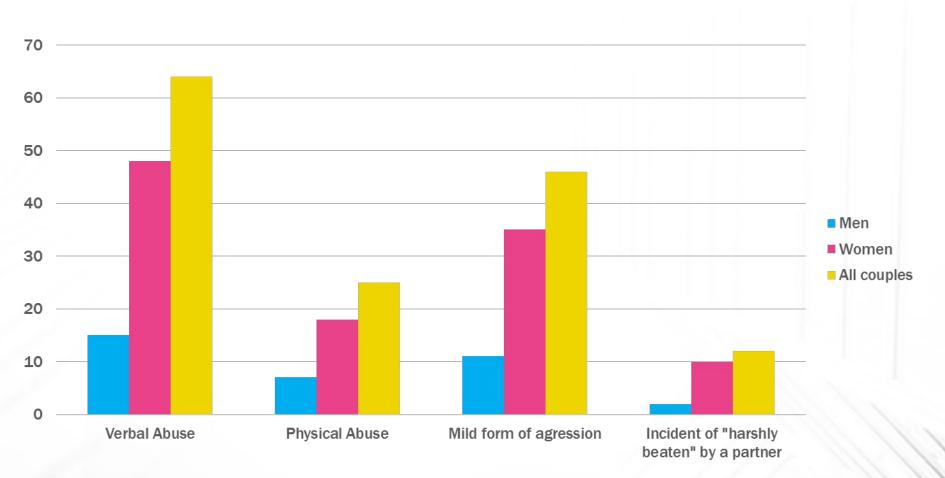
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Domestic violence – what is it?

 Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior which involves violence or other abuse by one person in a domestic setting against another, such as in marriage or cohabitation.

Causes of domestic violence



- Rigid gender roles
- The "paradox of masculinity"
- Mental illnesses
- Perpetrators were themselves abused as children
- Drug and alcohol abuse

Types of abuse

Physical abuse

 Using physical force to control an intimate partner by pushing, biting, punching, throwing objects at the partner, or assaulting them with a weapon.

Sexual abuse

• Using words, actions, or threats to force another to engage in sexual activities against their will.

Psychological abuse

 Using words or actions to isolate, humiliate, demean, intimidate, or control an intimate partner.

What does a victim feel?

Threat of "outing"

Extreme isolation

Lack of access to the legal system

Lack of civil rights protections

The perpetrator's threat to take the children away

Consequences of domestic violence

- Higher rates of many chronic conditions
- High risk health behaviors and shortened life span
- Posttraumatic stress disorder
- · Interfere child's life
- Suicide
