Scottish bacteriologist Alexander Fleming was born on August 6, 1881 in the county of East Ayrshire



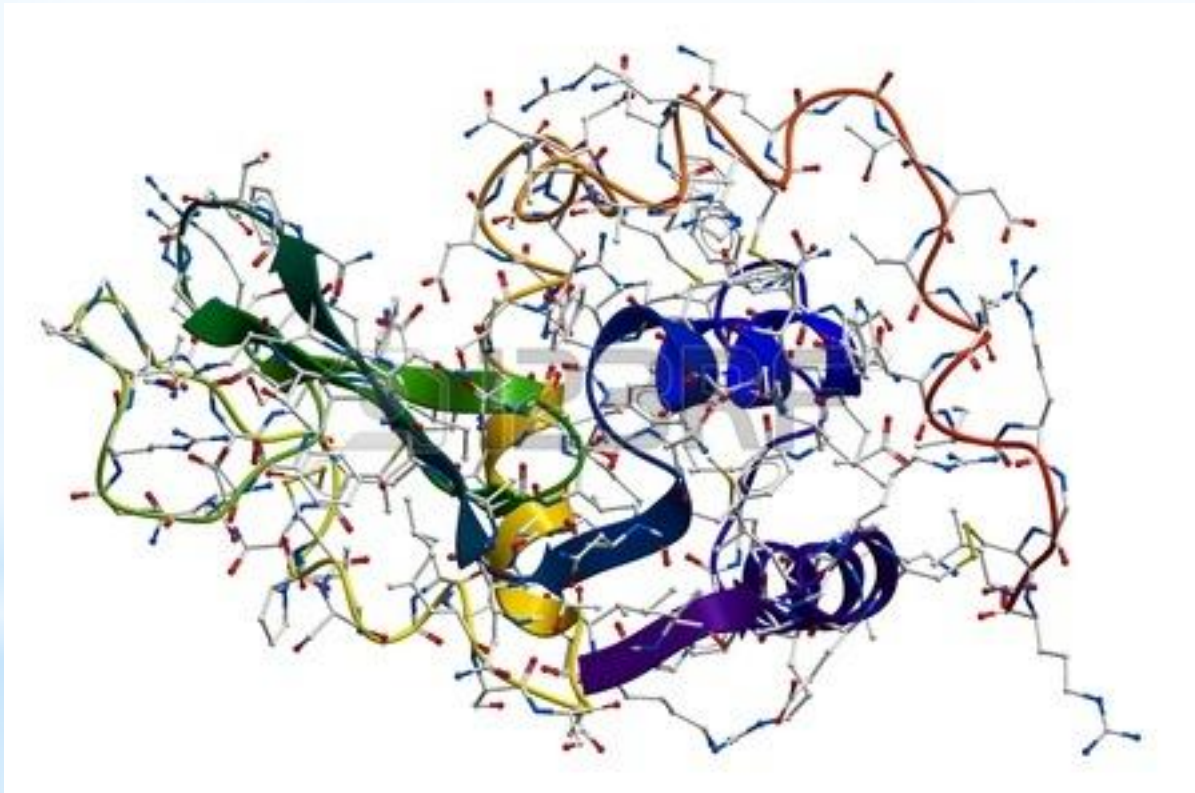
After graduating from university,

Fleming showed that carbolic acid in the treatment of wounds harms more than helps



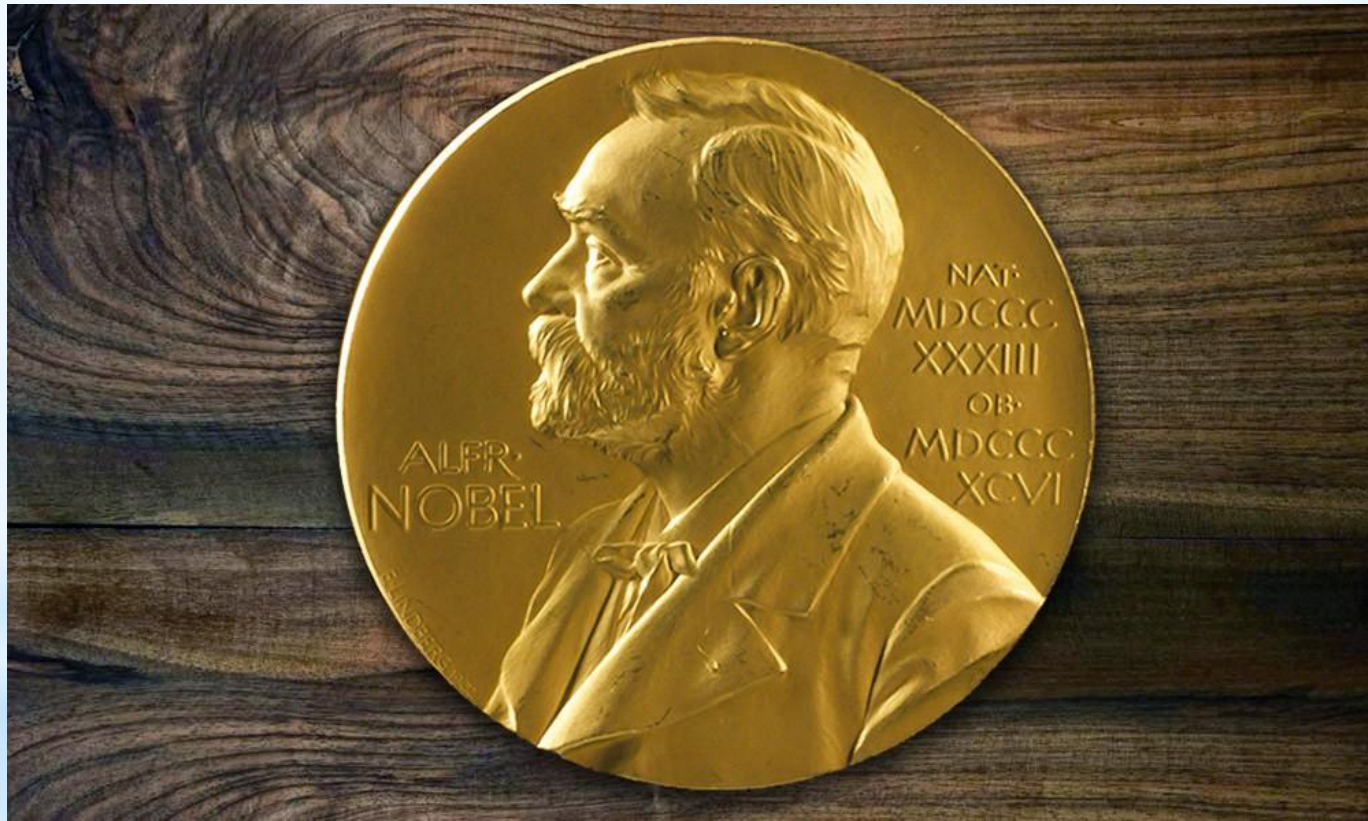

The Nobel Prize in Medicine



In the remaining ten years of his life, the scientist was awarded 25 honorary degrees, 26 medals, 18 prizes, 13 awards and honorary membership in 89 academies of science and scientific societies, and in 1954 a noble rank.
