Let Us Read

Learn to read the words and sentences: first read them to yourself, then aloud as quickly as you can.

[c] **dress**, I dress, she dresses. She takes a shower and then dresses. Before he goes to school he dresses.

— Do you do exercises every day? — Yes, I do exercises every day. My father doesn't go to the swimming pool every day, but my mother does.

[c] **breakfast**, **have breakfast**. — When do you usually have breakfast? — I usually have breakfast at eight o'clock.

[A] **lunch**, **have lunch**. Do you have lunch at eleven or at twelve o'clock? — I usually have lunch at eleven o'clock. — When does your mother usually have lunch? — She usually has lunch at twelve o'clock.

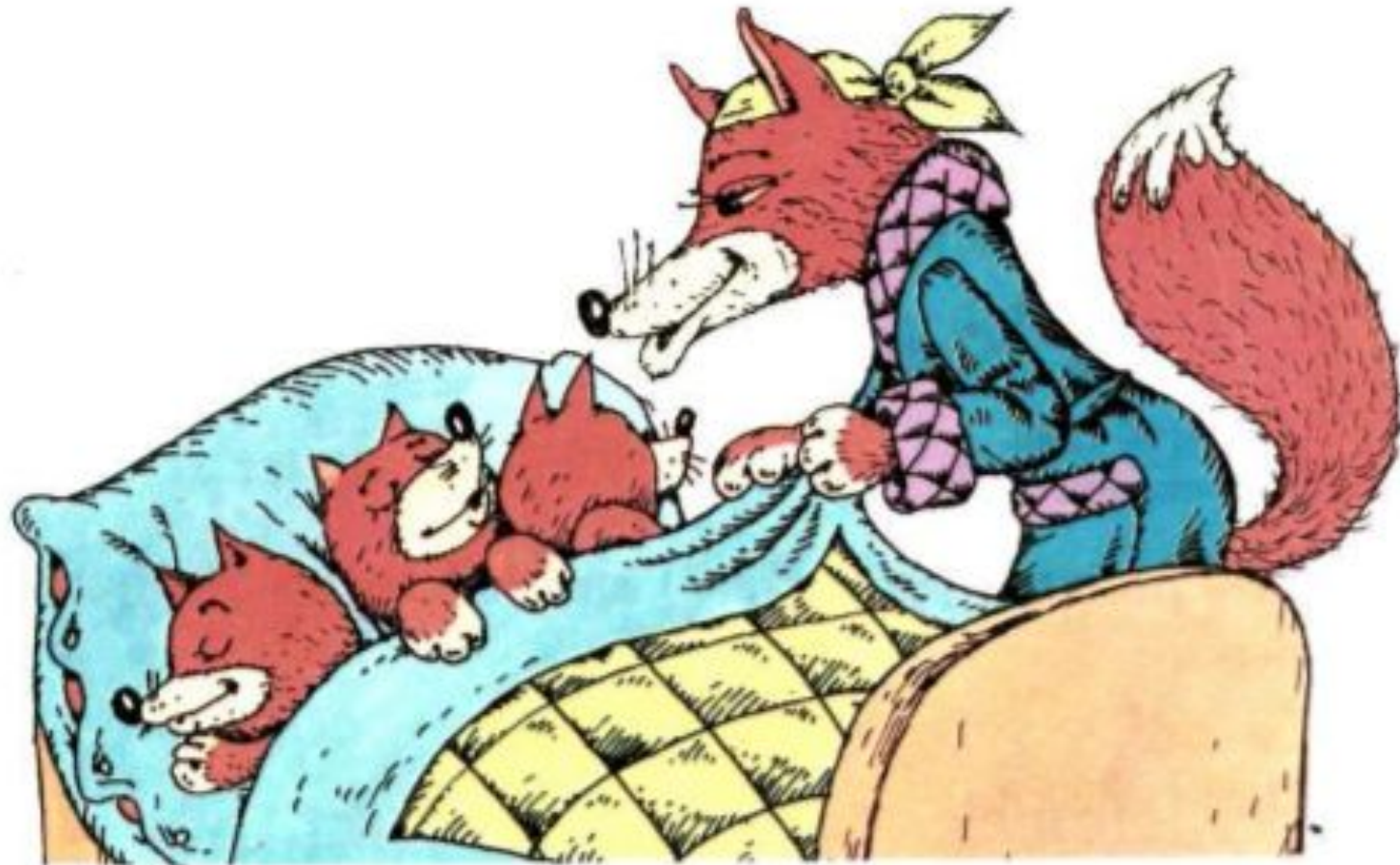
