A German company has merged with three other companies located in Italy, Portugal and Spain. The German business owner registers the change with the German business register.



The business registers of Portugal, Spain and Italy, now contain information on companies that no longer exist, which can be a risk to citizens, businesses or public entities.

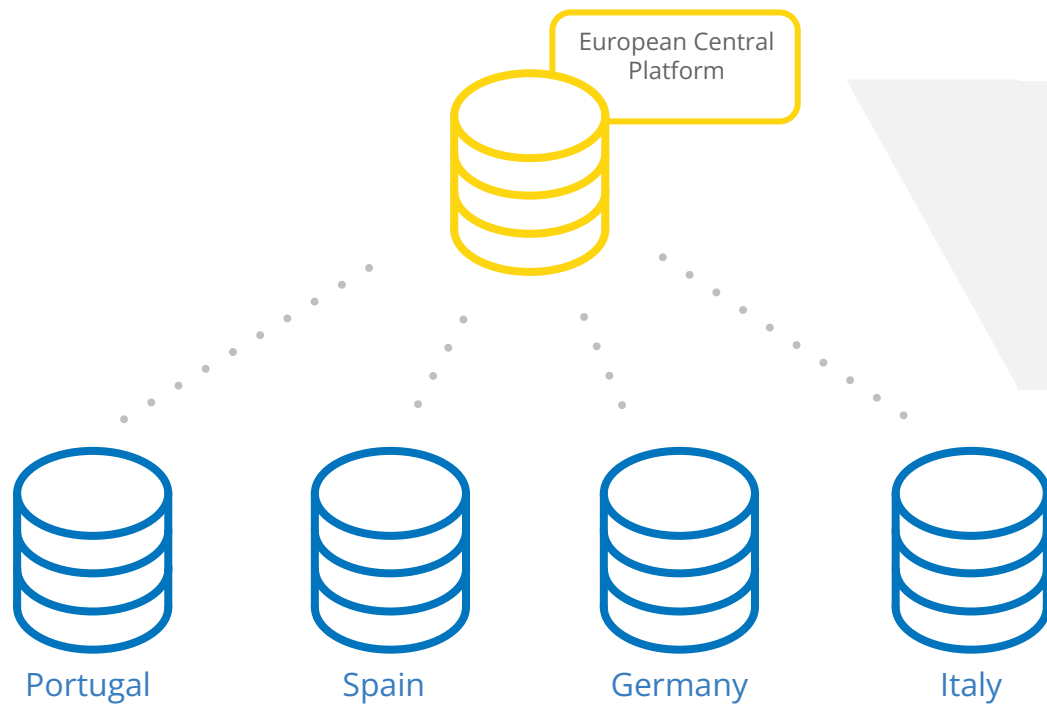

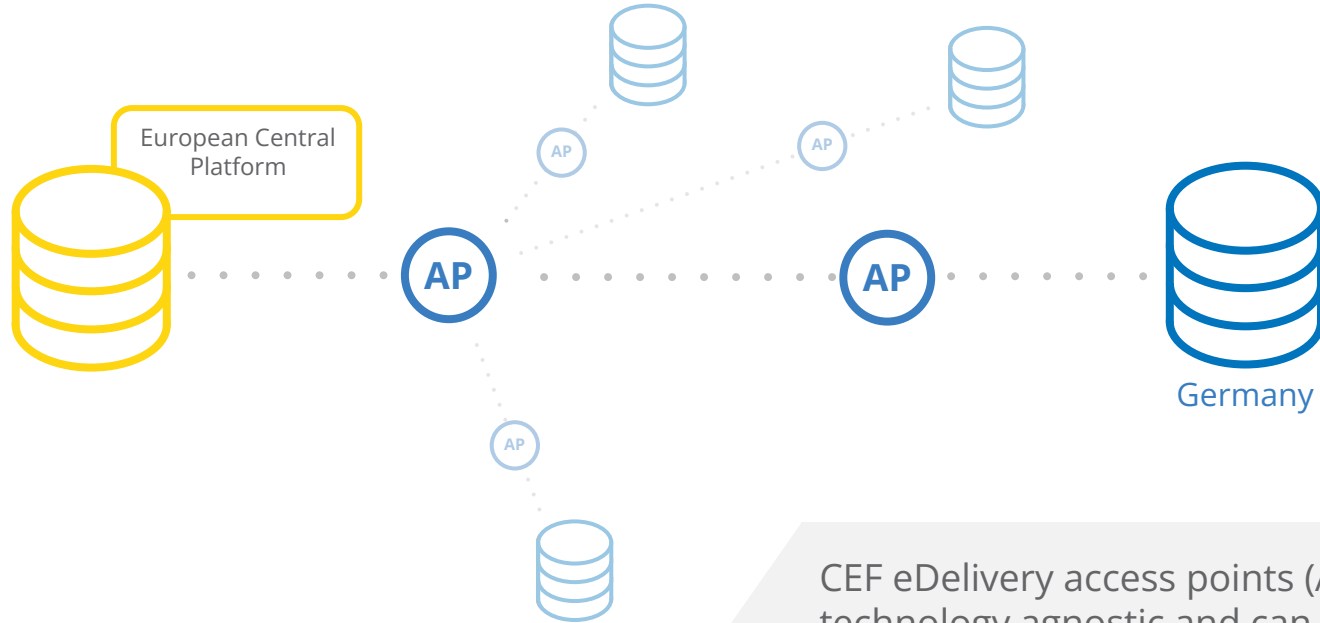
Ensuring all records are up-to-date, creates an administrative burden and expense for business and public administrations.

# BRIS



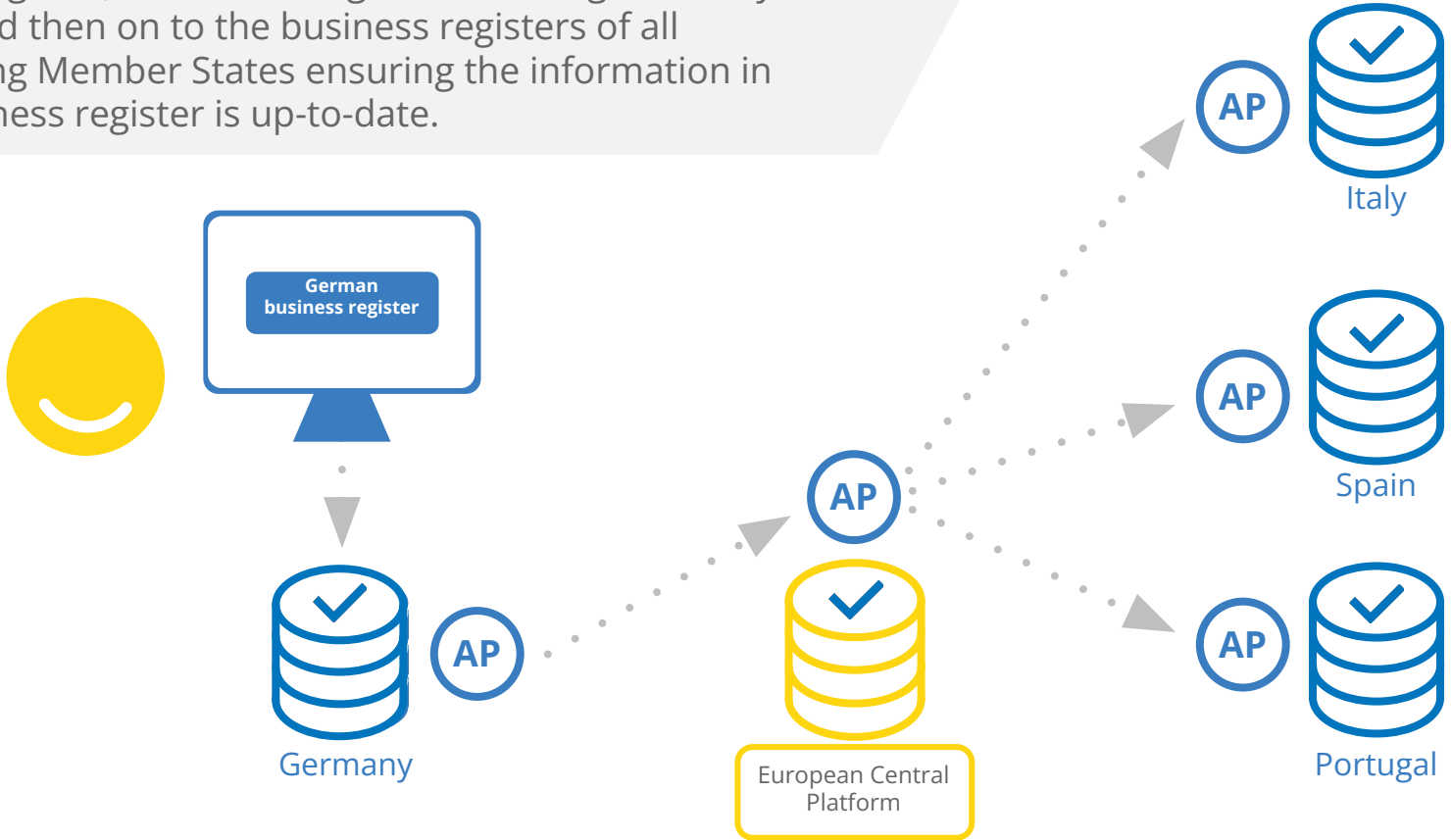
To reduce the burden on businesses and public administrations and facilitate the functioning of the Digital Single Market the European Commission and Member States have created the business register interconnection system (BRIS).

BRIS uses the CEF eDelivery building block to securely connect the business registers of all 31 participating countries.

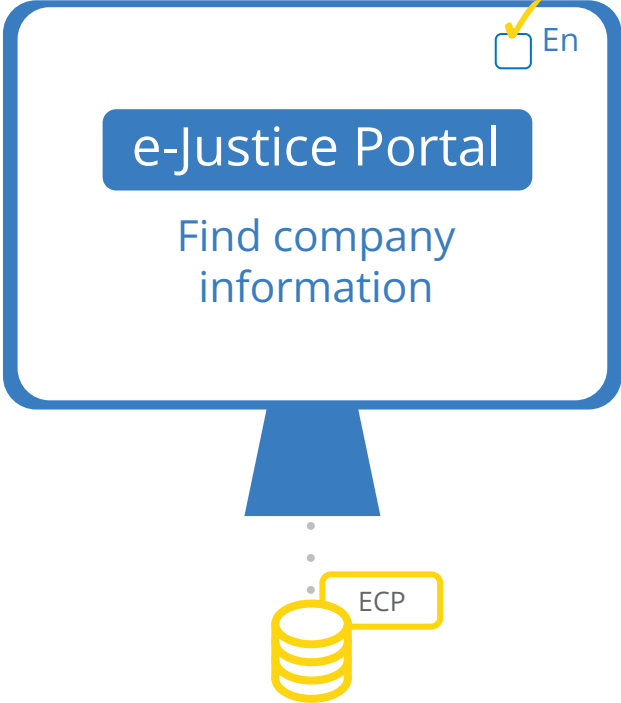


CEF eDelivery access points (AP) are technology agnostic and can be used to connect a broad range of IT systems that have been developed independently.

Now, when the German business owner updates his national business register, a BRIS message is sent using eDelivery to the ECP and then on to the business registers of all participating Member States ensuring the information in every business register is up-to-date.



Now that all Business Register information is centralized in the ECP, it is accessible through one common portal: the e-Justice Portal.



Now all European consumers, businesses and public entities have a one-stop shop where they can find information on approximately 20 million companies across Europe.
