



• **Borrow** is like *take*:

Can I borrow your pen?

• Lend is like *give*:

**Lend** me your comb for a minute, please.

- In Passive Voice lend (not borrow) can be used.
- **Cost** is to have a price:

The dress costs 50 pounds.
