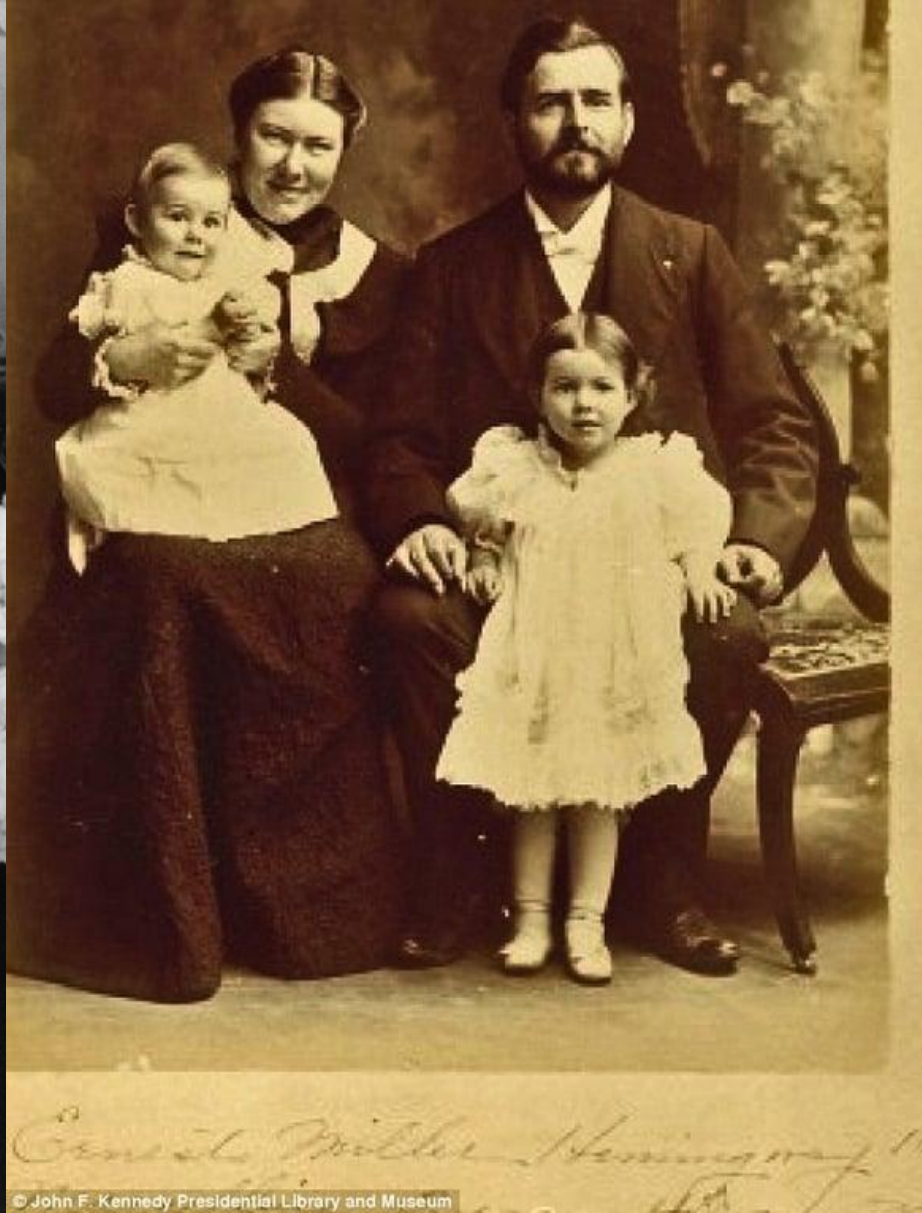

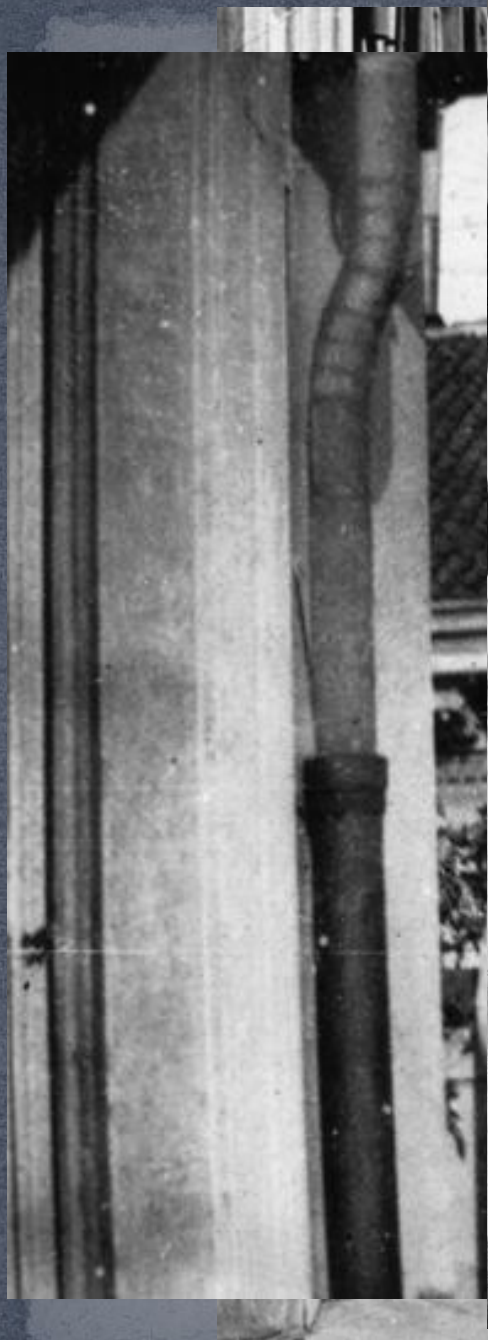

The Super-man Myth

By Ernest M. Hemingway.

JACK DEMPSEY, a well-built, snowing, hard faced citizen of Utah, is regarded as a super-man by several millions of people. He has been pronounced the greatest fighter of all time, the hardest hitter, and the fastest heavyweight that ever climbed through the ropes. Many people fear for the safety of Georges Carpentier's life, when he shuts himself into the ring with this tremendous primitive force.

Most persons acquainted with things pugilistic believe that Jack Dempsey won the title of heavyweight champion of the world from Jess Willard at Toledo, Ohio, July 4th, 1919. The formal transfer of the crown did take place there—but Jess Willard lost the title in the Baltimore Hotel in Kansas City, Missouri.

Willard's stupid, kindly face, shined by his efforts to make the best of the last few months before the strict enforcement of the 13th amendment, was one of the landmarks of the Baltimore. Jess Willard hated fighting and he was very fond of drinking. That doesn't make an ideal temperament for a fighter—but Willard never was a fighter at heart.

PICKED by fate and Jack Curley, to be the man to defeat the renegade Johnson in a bout that had been in bad odor with every one acquainted with the back-scene workings of championship fighters, Willard became the champion. He defended his title once in a no decision fight against Frank Moran, a

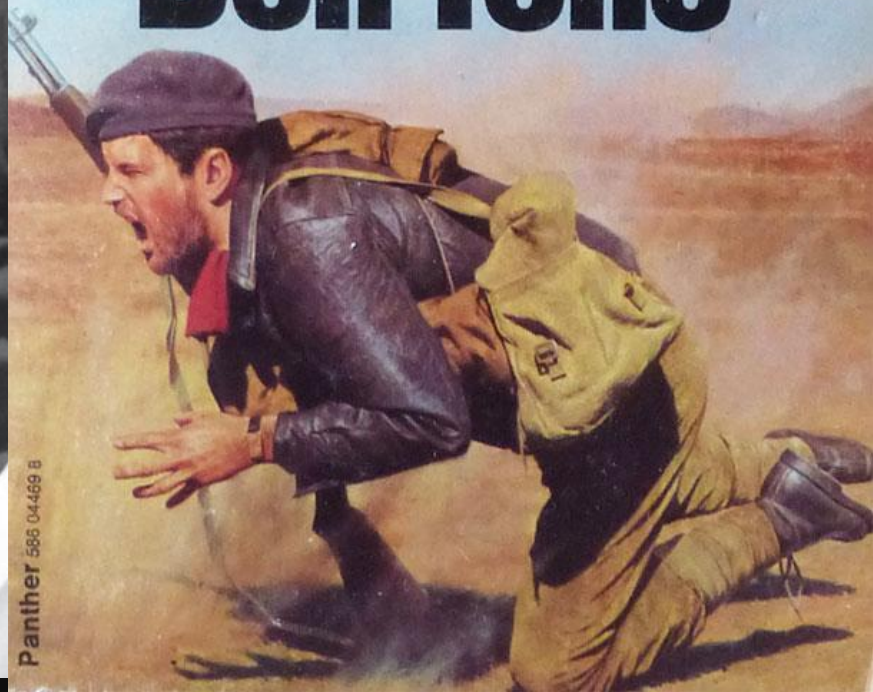

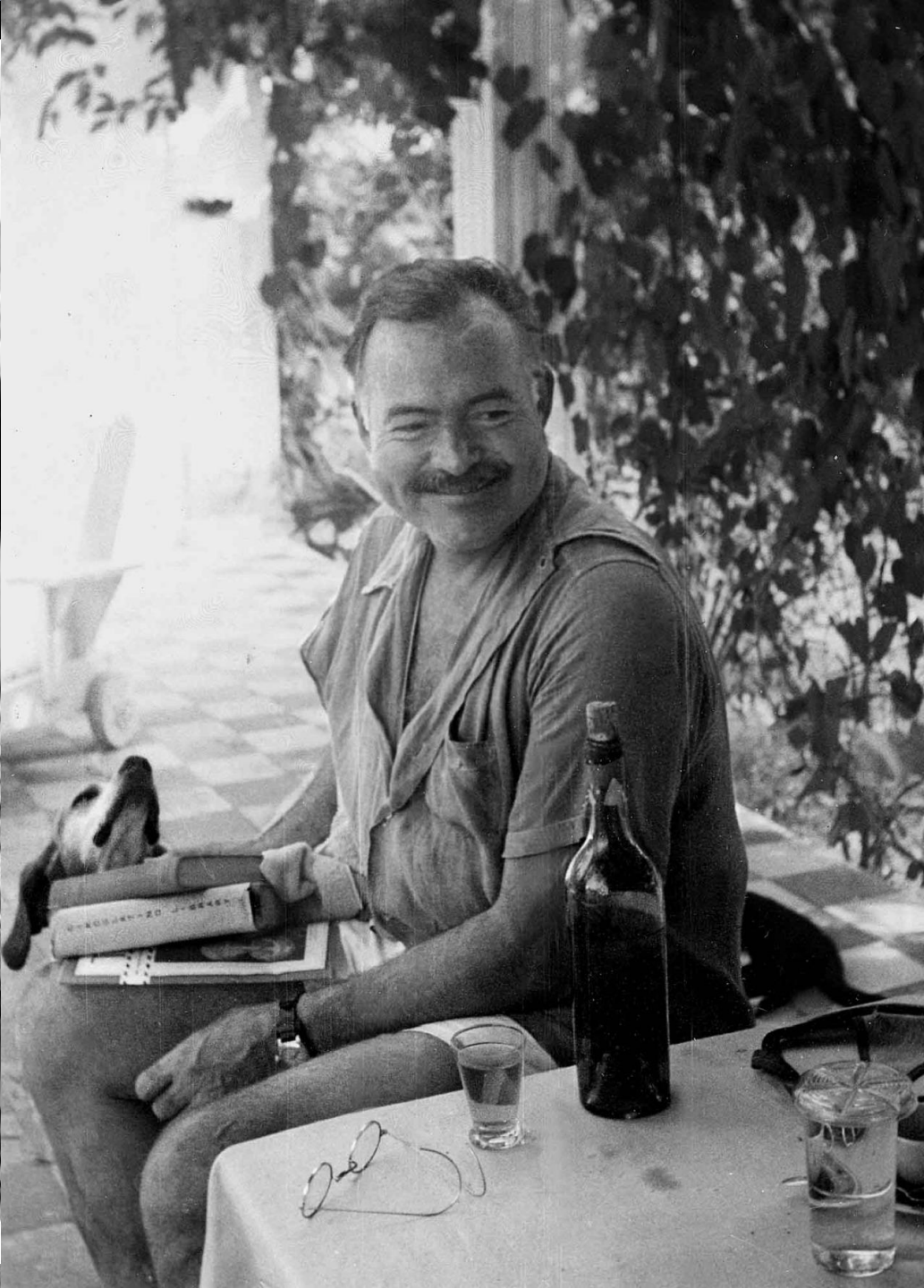

- Ernest Hemingway survived through anthrax, malaria, pneumonia, dysentery, skin cancer, hepatitis, anemia, diabetes, high blood pressure, two plane crashes, a ruptured kidney, a ruptured spleen, a ruptured liver, a crushed vertebra, a fractured skull, mortar shrapnel wounds, three car crashes and bushfire burns.

- There's a popular tale circulating about Hemingway betting fellow writers that he could write a short story in just six words. The story goes that Hemingway gave them:
"For Sale: baby shoes. Never worn,"

and he won the bet.

Variations on the theme of Ground Beef ---3

PAPA'S FAVORITE HAMBURGER. There is no reason why a fried hamburger has to turn out gray, greasy, paper-thin and tasteless. You can add all sorts of goodies and flavors to the ground beef - minced mushrooms, cocktail sauce, minced garlic and onion, ~~grated~~ *chopped* almonds, a big dollop of Picadilli, or whatever your eye lights on. Papa prefers this combination.

- Ingredients --
- 1 lb. ground lean beef
 - 2 cloves, minced garlic
 - 2 little green onions, finely chopped *or less*
 - 1 heaping teaspoon, India relish
 - 2 tablespoons, capers
 - 1 heaping teaspoon, ~~grind~~ *Spice Islands Ground Sage*
 - Spice Islands Beau Monde Seasoning - $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon
 - Spice Islands Mei Yen Powder - $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon, *salt & pepper*
 - 1 egg, beaten in a cup with a fork
 - About one-third cup dry red or white wine.

What to do -- Break up the meat with a fork and scatter the garlic, onion and dry seasonings over it, then mix them into the meat with a fork or your fingers. Let the bowl of meat sit out of the icebox for ten or fifteen minutes while you set the table and make the salad. Add the relish, capers, everything else including wine and let the meat sit, quietly marinating, for another ten minutes if possible. Now make four fat, juicy patties with your hands. The patties should be an inch thick, and soft in texture but not runny. Have the oil in your frying-pan hot but not smoking when you drop in the patties and then turn the heat down and fry the burgers about four minutes. Take the pan off the burner and turn the heat high again. Flip the burgers over, put the pan back on the hot fire, then after one minute, turn the heat down again and cook another three minutes. Both sides of the burgers should be crispy brown and the middle pink and juicy.
