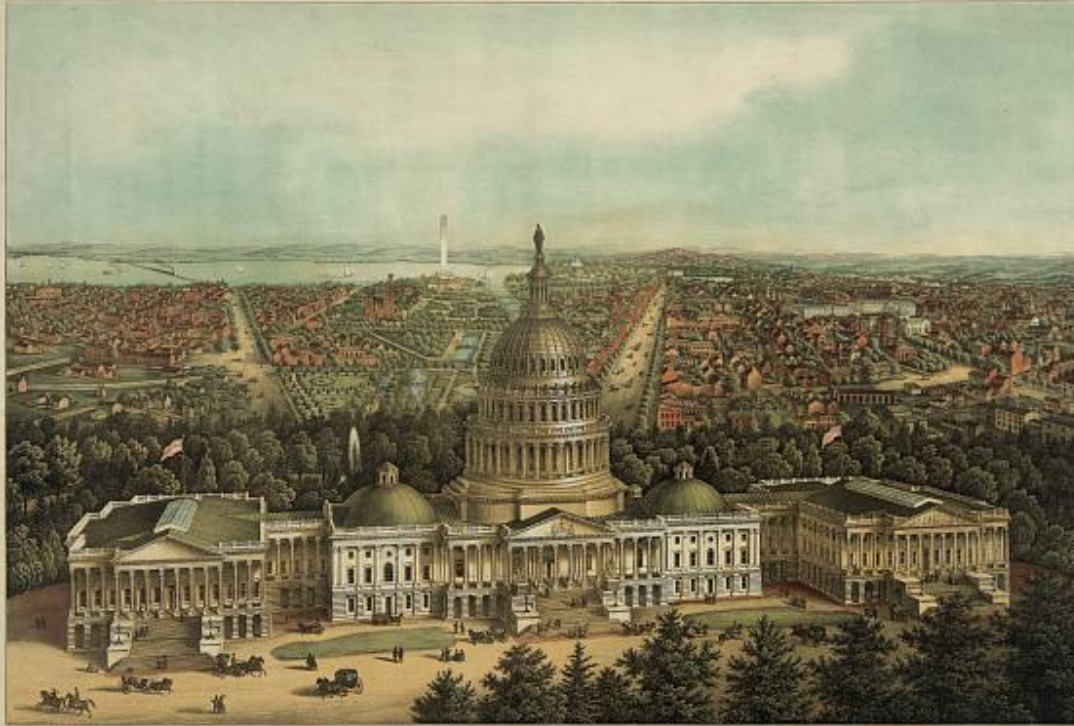

Washington, D.C. (District of Columbia), is the capital of the USA.



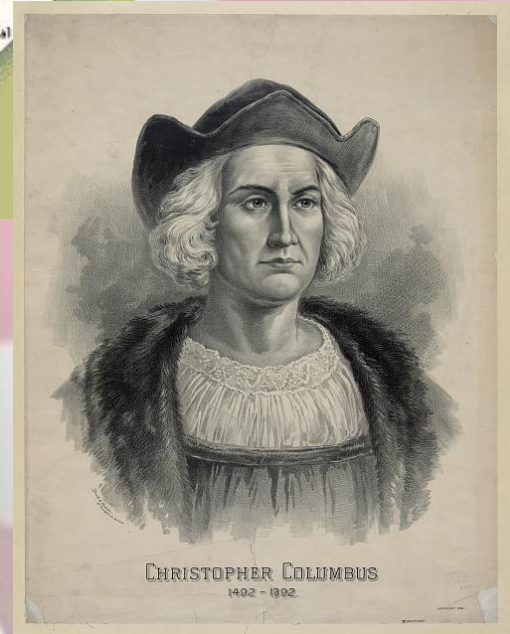
It is named after the first President of the United States George Washington.

The Official date of the discovery of America is October 12, 1492.

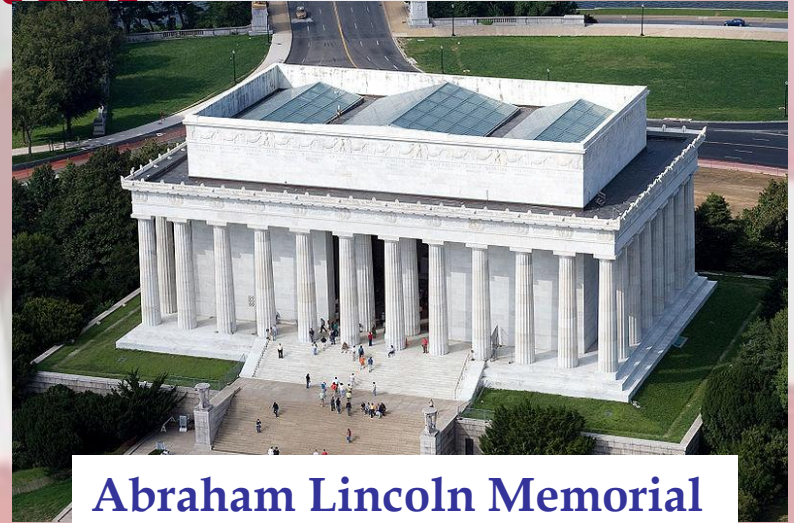

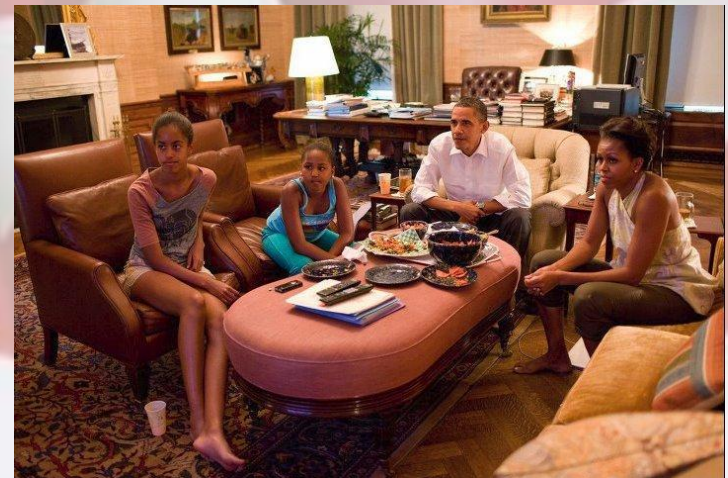

- It is situated in 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue.



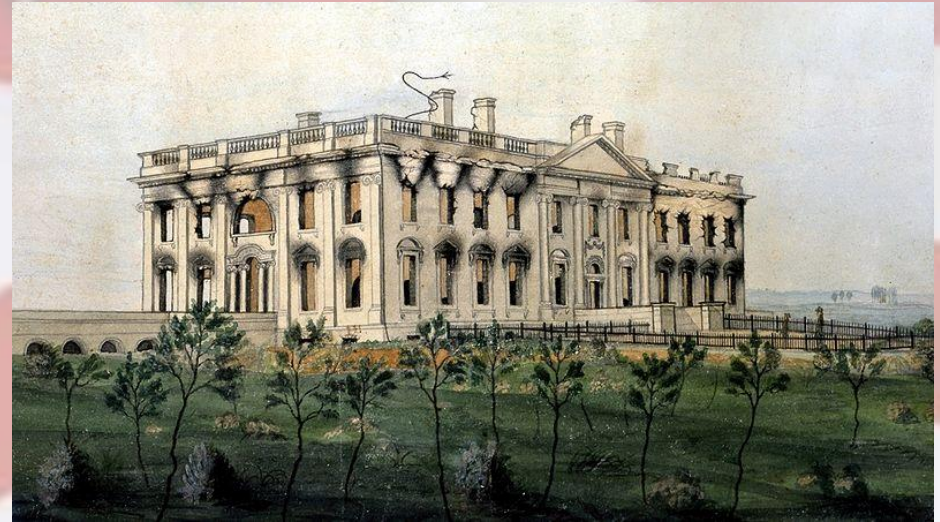
- It is the home of the President and his family.

The White House has got very beautiful gardens.



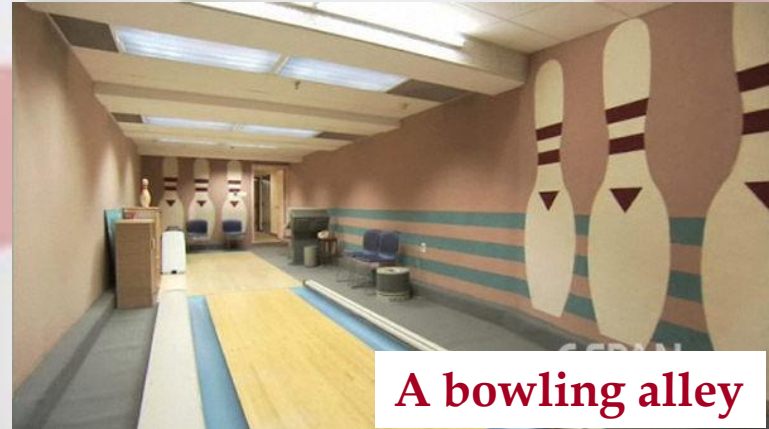
There are two fountains: one in front of the building, the other at the back of the White House.
