Example: <u>I've got</u> a brother. He'<u>s got</u> a new jacket.

### IN NEGATIVE SENTENCES AND QUESTIONS, WE USE <u>ANY</u> BEFORE PLURAL NOUNS.

Example: I <u>haven't got</u> a brother.

I haven't got <u>any</u> brothers.


