

Comparative adverbs

- Most comparative adverbs are made with *more*.
- You can get in *more cheaply* with a family ticket.
- Adverbs that took the same as their adjectives. For example, *fast, early, hard, long, high* and a few others, *late, soon* use *-er* and *-est*.
- On Saturdays we close much *later*, at ten.
- Irregular adverbs:
 - *well – better*
 - *badly - worse*
