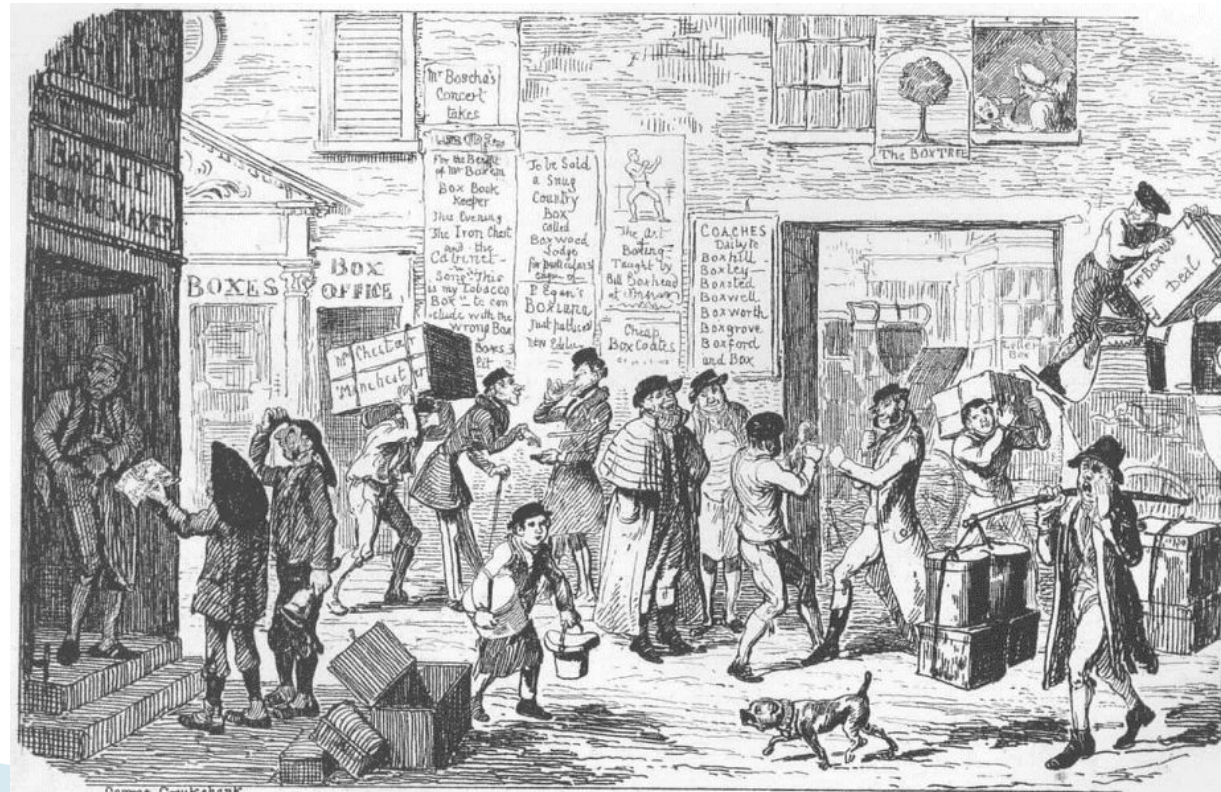
December 26th
