First experiment

Task

- People type unimportant facts into a computer

Understood the computer would save the information

Understood the computer wouldn't save it

Remember the information better

Second experiment

Task

- People remember facts, knowing where to find them on the computer

Remember the folder location better than the facts

The result

- Using the internet develop stronger transactive memory



Transactive memory



People don't remember the information itself, they remember where it is stored

3. Paraphrasing or restructuring ideas without stating where it comes from

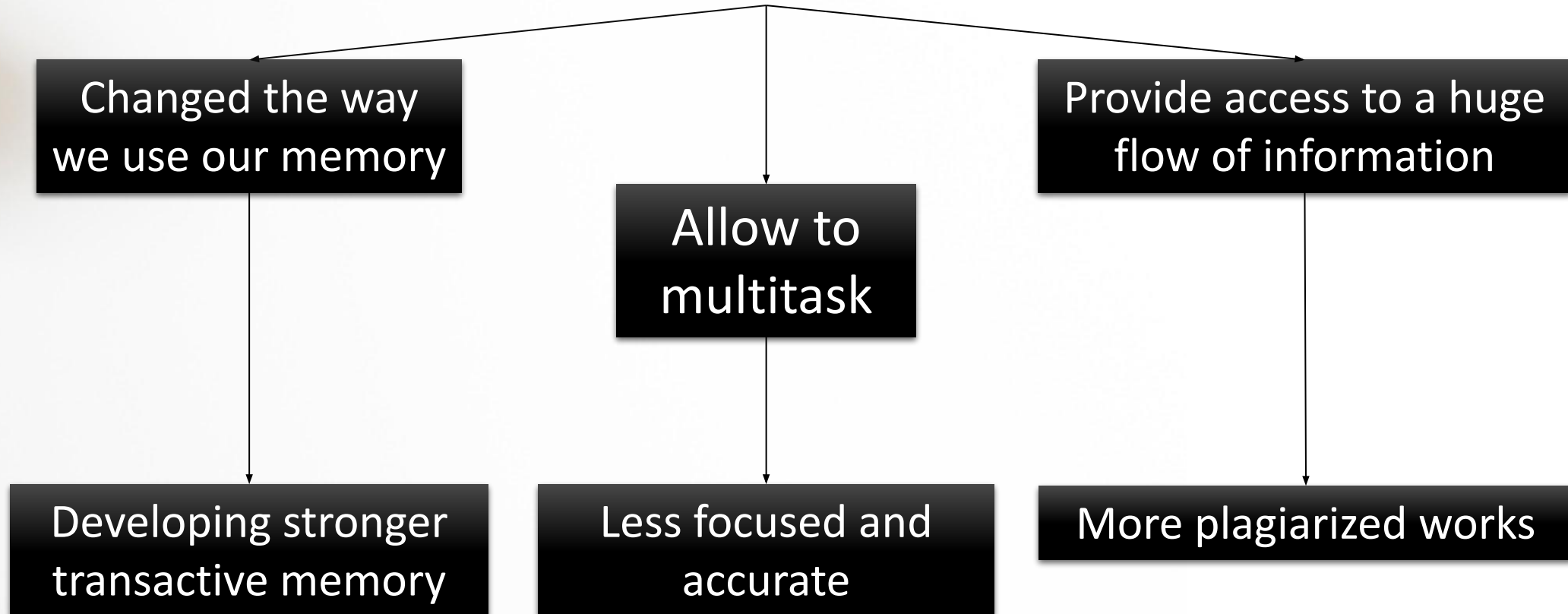


How to avoid Plagiarism
