Vineyards of South Africa

- The main part of the best vineyards are concentrated in the South-West of the country within a radius of 150 km from the capital Cape town
- The total area of vineyards exceeds 100,000 hectares
- World famous wines are from the region Stellenbosch, Paarl, Durbanville, Swartland, etc.



History



February 2, 1659. On this day, the Governor of Cape town Jan van Riebeek made a record that planted shortly before the vineyards gave the first wine.

In the 19th century, during the war between France and England, South African wine had a chance to enter the international market, and wine production volumes increased 9 times in a short time.

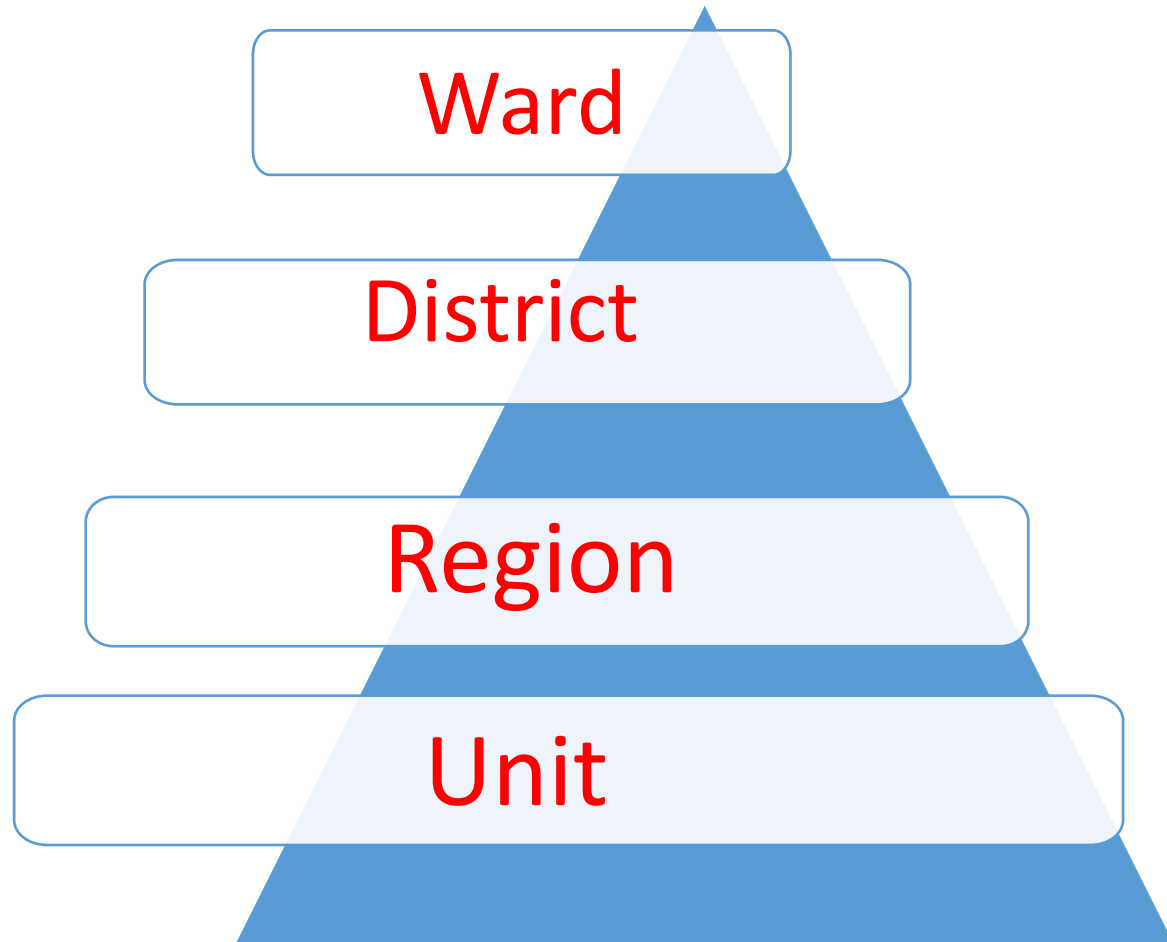
At the beginning of the XX century, when the first regulatory and controlling organization was created — the United cooperative of winemakers of South Africa (KWV)

1973. - introduced classification of wines of South Africa. South Africa was the first country in the new world to apply the geographical principle of wine labeling

1994-the abolition of the apartheid regime and the return of South African wines to the international market

Classification

- 1973-adopted a system developed on the basis of the French AOR. Wine of Origin (WO), implies division into 4 levels. This classification refers to high quality wines
- At the moment, there are more than 80 WO.
- "Estate wine" - means local wine, ie grapes come from the territory of one estate, where the winery is located.
- "Single vineyard" - grapes for wine comes from a separate vineyard, but it should not exceed 6 hectares.
