*We use **some** for affirmative and polite sentences (or when you hope/ expect the answer to be « yes »):*

- I've got some good news.*
- They've got something to say.*
- Would you like some tea?*
- Can I have some more cake, please?*



Don't forget....

*We use **any** for questions and negatives:*

I haven't got any good news.

She hasn't got any sisters.

Have they got any wine?

~~*Has he got a car?*~~

(mistake on the tapescript)

He hasn't got

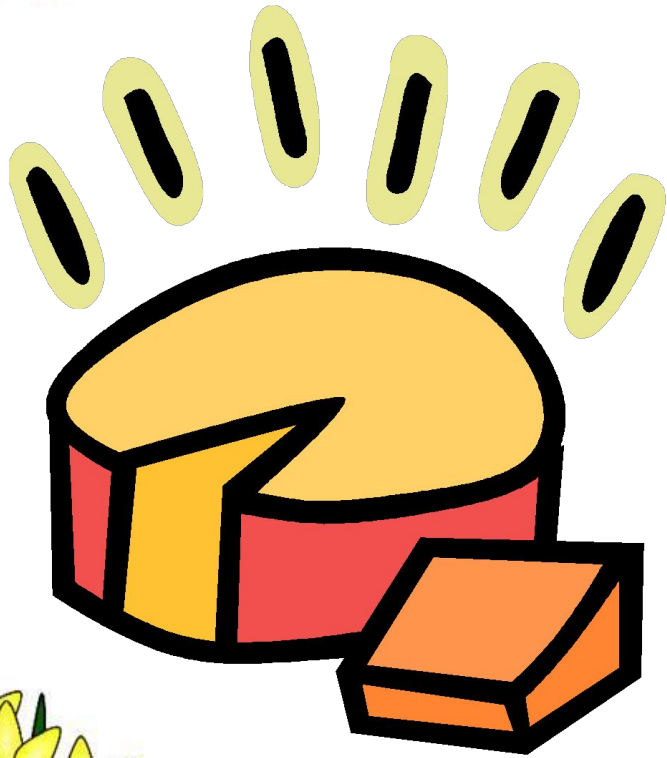

I've got **some**..... cheese

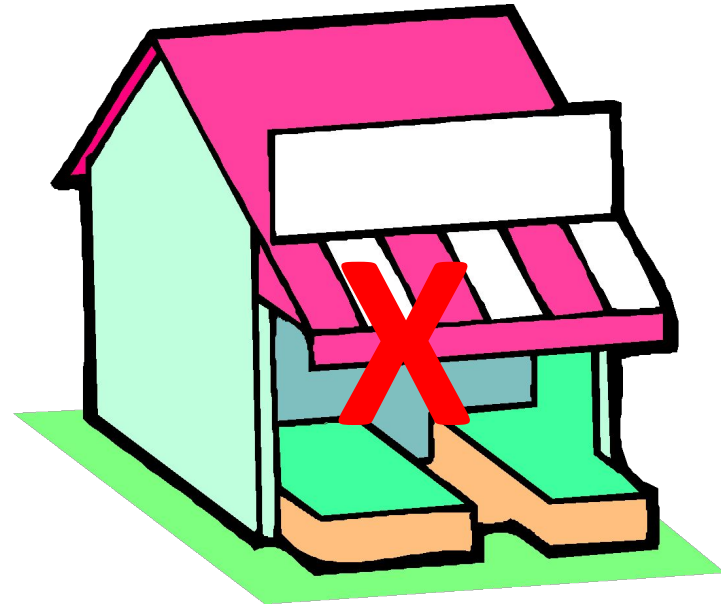
but I haven't got **any**.....
