he could have passed the test.



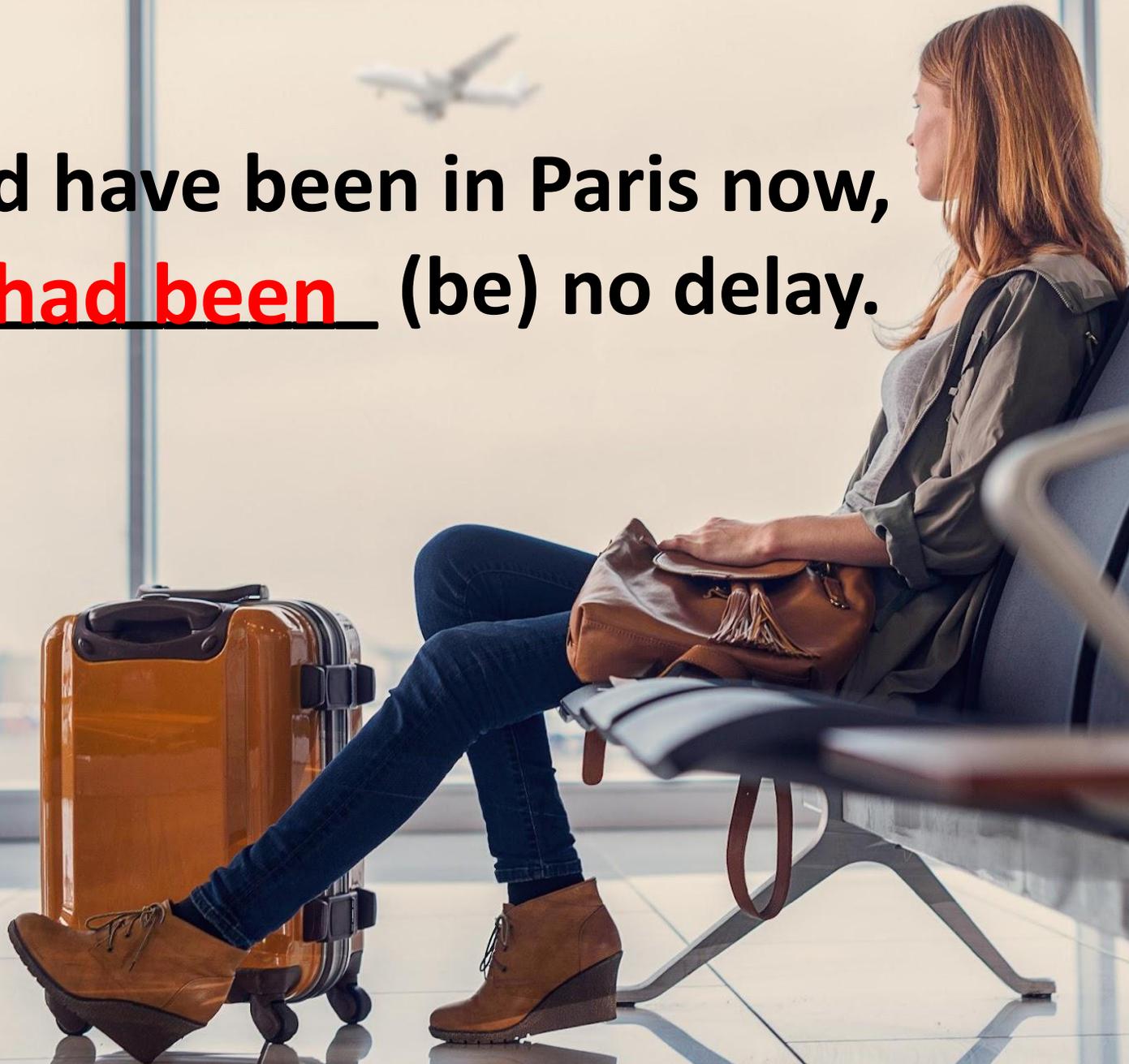


If I were (be) you, I would never talk to him again.
