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Заметки для учителя

“Jeopardy” – это американское ТВ-шоу, которое стало прототипом «Своей игры».

В игре для школы мы сохраняем большинство правил «Своей Игры», но отвечать разрешаем всем командам одновременно (при помощи карточек с цифрами 1, 2, 3, 4). В игре могут принимать участие 2-4 команды

Ход игры.

- Каждая команда садится вокруг своего стола. На каждый стол учитель кладет 4 карточки с цифрами 1, 2, 3, 4.
- Одна из команд выбирает вопрос. Учитель зачитывает вопрос. Команды обдумывают 30 секунд (на каждом слайде есть часы). После второго звукового сигнала команды сдают учителю карточки с номером выбранного ответа.
- Нажимаем “Show the answer” (внизу слайда). Начисляем очки за правильные ответы. Для удобства учителя в правом верхнем углу показана цена вопроса.
- Нажимаем «домик» (в правом нижнем углу) и возвращаемся к главному меню (таблице с вопросами).
- Другая команда выбирает вопрос, и игра продолжается по той же схеме.




