

NEGATIVE: be + not + going to







- (f) *Are* they *going to go* home at 6 PM? No, they aren't.
- (g) *Is* Alex going to be at school tomorrow? Yes, he is.
- (h) What time *are* you *going to play* tennis? Around noon.

QUESTION: be + subject + going to Are you going to go to work on Monday?

yes go to work



Yes, I am
I'm going to go to
work of Monday.

no watch the news

No, I'm not _.

I'm not going to watch the news on TV .

Are you going to watch the news on TV?



yes study English

Are you going to study English this year?

Yes, I am
I'm going to study
English this year.

FUTURE

tomorrow morning tomorrow evening tomorrow night

next week

He's going to go to the doctor next week.







She went home last spring.

She's going to go home **next spring**.




PAST

What is something you are doing this year?

take guitar lessons

<u>I am taking</u> guitar lessons.





What is something you are going to do this year?

graduate from nursing school



I am going to graduate from nursing school.



They will arrive at 10:00 tomorrow.





- (a) They will arrive at 10:00 tomorrow.
- (b) They **are going to arrive** at 10:00 tomorrow.

(c) CORRECT: Jane will see a movie.

INCORRECT: Jane will sees a movie.

INCORRECT: Jane wills see a movie.



(d) CORRECT: Jane will come today.

INCORRECT: Jane will comes today. ?



(e) CORRECT: Jane will eat breakfast.

INCORRECT: Jane will to eat breakfast.?

CONTRACTIONS

(h) Amy won't be at work tomorrow.



(a) Will Rita go tomorrow?

ANSWER

Yes, she will. No, she won't.



MAIN
WILL + SUBJECT + VERB

(b) Will they go home later?

ANSWER

Yes, they will. No, they won't.


