□ The UK has been a member of European union (EU) and its predecessor the European Economic Community (EEC) since 1973; it is also a member of Commonwealth of Nations, the council of Europe, the G7, the G8, the G20, NATO and the World Trade Organization (WTO).







INFLUENCE

The UK has a great power with considerable economic, cultural, military, scientific, and political influence internationally. It is a recognised nuclear weapones state and its military expenditure ranks fourth in the world.

The UK is said to have a «Special Relationship» with the United States and a close partnership with France – the «Entente cordiale» - and shares nuclear weapons with both countries.











