New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) – the world's largest stock exchange by money circulation.

NYSE Exchange was founded May 17, 1792 after the signing of the agreement 24 the New York brokers (at the time the transaction took place in coffee shops), entitled «Button Wood Agreement» the creation of the New York Stock Exchange.



Originally the name was «New York Stock & Exchange Board», but in 1863 the exchange was renamed «New York Stock Exchange»



On September 1987 a place on the NYSE was worth about 1.15 million dollars, which gave hope to the good market prospects.

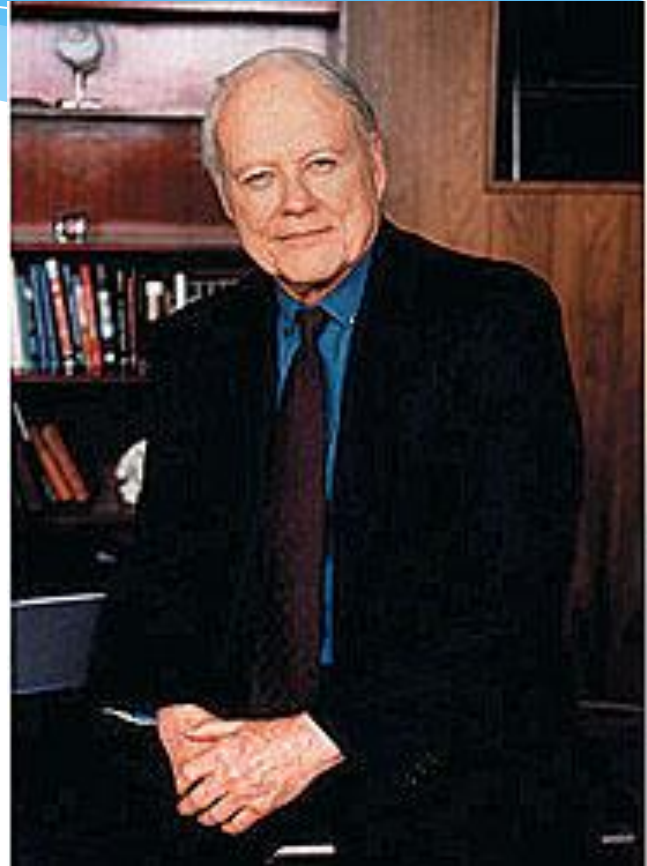




Places of members can be sold, the cost per seat now comes to \$ 3 million.

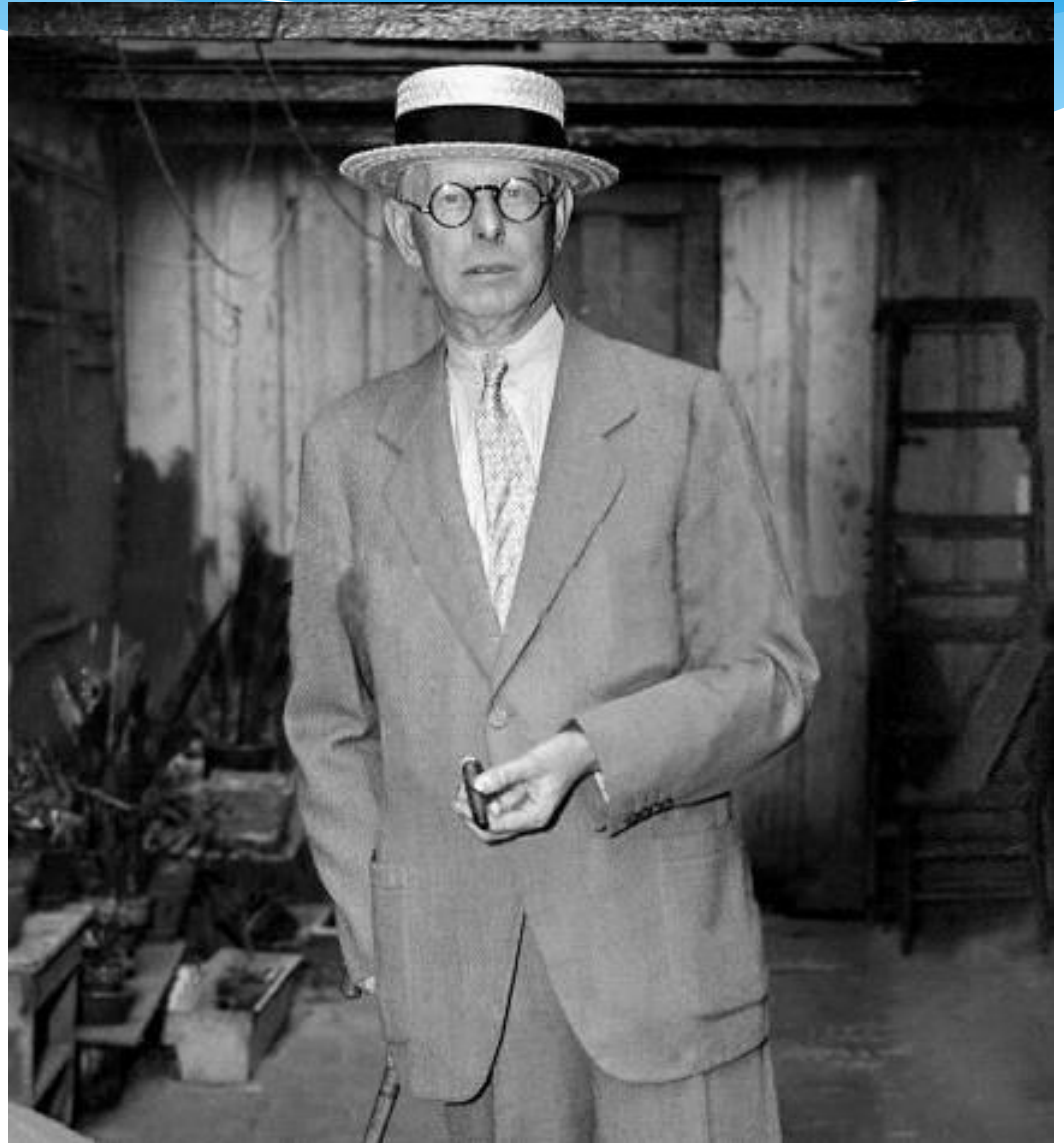
Famous brokers that have influenced the development of the NYSE

O'Neill, William - bought a seat on the New York Stock Exchange under the age of 30 years (the youngest broker in the history of the exchange), the creator of the first daily computer database of the stock market in the United States 1963-1964.

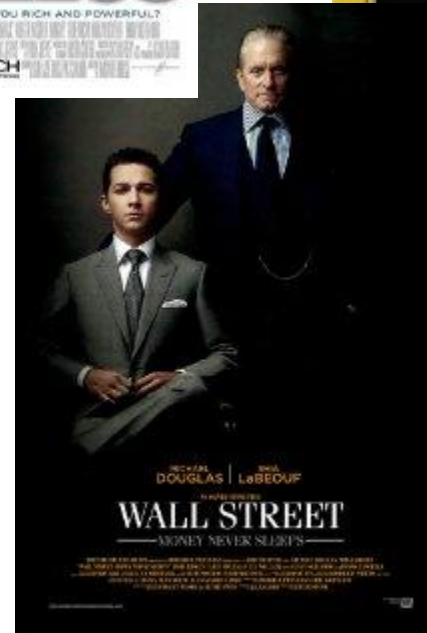
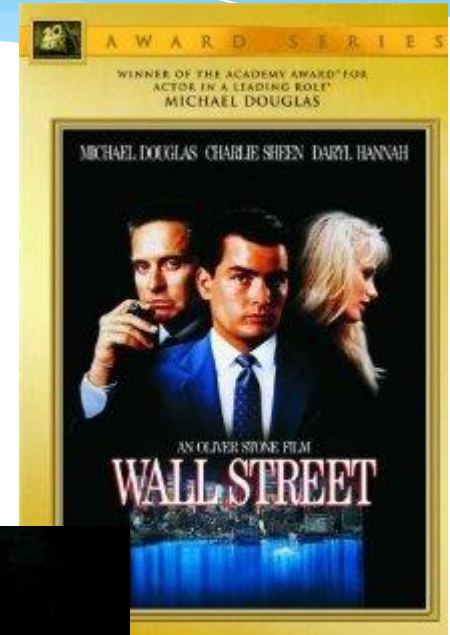
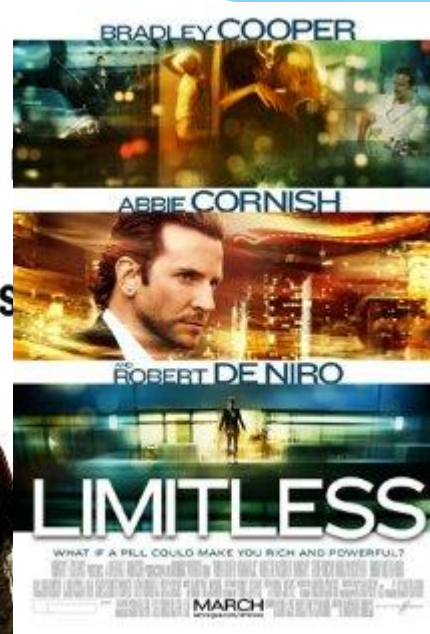
