
# **QUESTION TAGS**

#### What is it?

- A question tag is a short question at the end of a statement.
- Question tags are used when asking for agreement or confirmation.



#### With the verb "TO BE":

Repeat it in the question tag, but change the order:

```
She's a teacher, <u>isn't she</u>?

These earrings aren't yours, <u>are they</u>?

You were here last night, <u>weren't you</u>?

She was really happy, <u>wasn't she</u>?

WATCH!!!
```

I am a good listener, aren't I

I'm right, aren't I?

# With Simple tenses:



You use auxiliary verbs DO, DOES, DID (depends if it's Present or Past Simple).





```
He tries very hard, __doesn't he ? ______?

They don't work here, __don't they ____?

You ate pizza last night, __didn't you ____?

She didn't go to the cinema, __did she
```

#### With Continuous tenses:

You use the auxiliary verb 'to be' (am, is, are; was, were – depends if it's Present or Past Continuous).

The dog's barking, \_\_\_\_isn't it \_\_\_?

We aren't going out tonight, \_\_are we \_\_\_?

She was reading last night, \_\_wasn't she \_\_?

You weren't listening to me, \_\_were you \_\_?


The sentence was were the active voice by the active

#### With Perfect tenses:

You use the auxiliary verb HAVE or HAS, depending on the person.

They've been her for an hour, <u>haven't they</u>?

She hasn't phoned yet, <u>has she</u>?



#### With modal verbs:

You use the same modal verb but change the order.

We can't

stay here, can we?

```
You can run fast, <u>can't you</u>?

We must be quiet, <u>mustn't we</u>?

I should see the doctor, <u>shouldn't I</u>?
```

You couldn't swim when you were 2, <u>could you</u>

#### With WILL future:

You use will/won't, but change the order.

You'll look after him, won't you They won't be late, will they You will not pass, will you?

#### With Let's:

You use SHALL WE.

Let's go on a picnic, <u>shall we</u>? Let's not talk about this again, <u>shall we</u>?

Let's get married, shall we?



# With IMPERATIVES (commands or strong suggestions):

You use WON'T YOU or WILL YOU (sometimes also CAN, COULD or WOULD).

Sit down, \_\_won't you ?

Open the window, \_\_will you

Don't go outside, \_\_will you ?

Keep quiet, \_\_won't you \_\_?

Read aloud, won't you?

#### With EVERY-, SOME-, ANY-, NOBODY:

You use THEY:

```
No one cares, do they?
```

Everyone left, <u>didn't they</u>?

Somebody's left a bag here, <u>haven't they</u>?



# With EVERY-, SOME-, NOTHING:

You use IT.

Everything's OK, isn't it Nothing matters, <u>does it</u> Nothing matches, does it?
