Canada is the largest producer of zinc and uranium and also a source of many other natural resources such as gold, nickel, aluminum and lead. Many cities in northern Canada, where natural conditions impede agriculture, exist thanks to nearby mines or sources of wood.





Canada is one of the safest countries. Carrying weapons, unlike the United States, is prohibited. Crime rates are typically several times lower than in the United States. According to official police statistics, the crime rate, since 1990, has been steadily declining every 5 years.

Canada is considered safe in terms of road safety. If in neighboring America 10,9 cars account for about 1.98% of fatal accidents, then here this figure does not exceed 1.62%. The country is also bypassed by most natural disasters.
