THE WEATHER IN BRITAIN

In Britain, the **weather** is very **changeable**: it **rains** a lot, but the sun often shines too.

Winters can be **sometimes** cold, with an average **temperature** of 5° C in the south; there is often snow.

Summers can be cool or warm, but the temperature **does** not usually go above 30° C. It is **often** cloudy, and there are **fairly** grey **skies** for days or weeks **at a time**.

Days are **long** in summer and **short** in winter. There is sometimes fog, **but** not so often as foreigners think. British **people** never **know** what tomorrow's weather will be like.

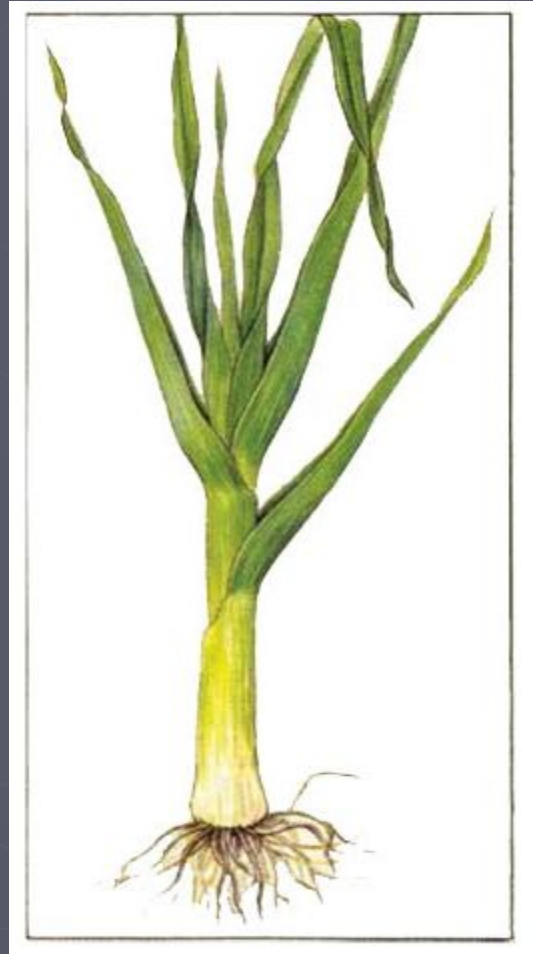
The red rose is

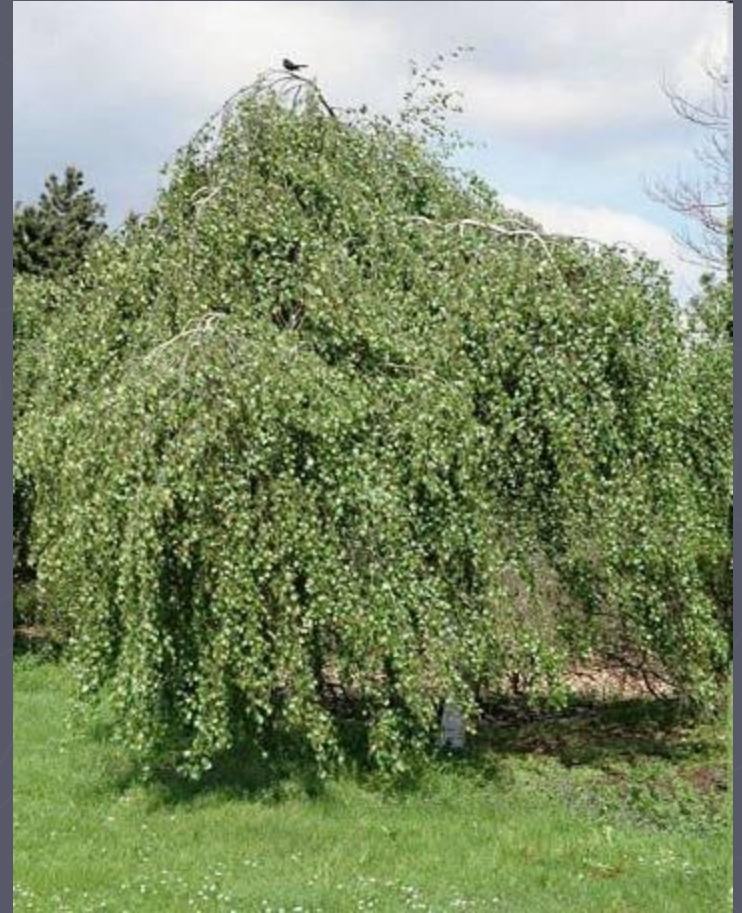

Scotland had mainly pine and birch.



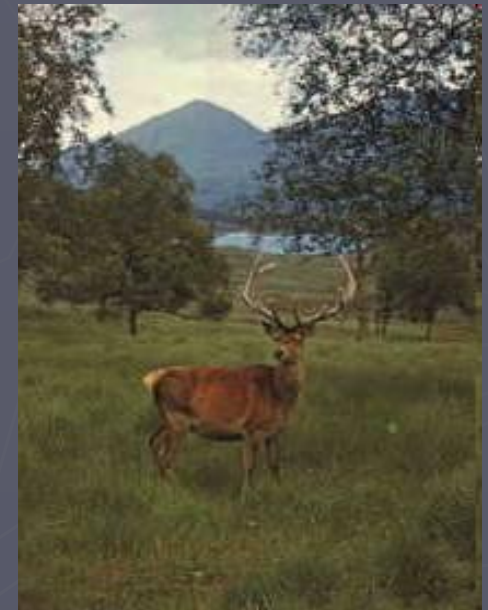
The Animal Life of the UK
