Key points: Morgan's kills seem to be well planned and thought-out, with a pattern that appears to follow three steps:

- 1) Identify and Observe 2) Prove, Prepare and Capture 3) Ritual, Execute and Disposal
- Morgan also seems to follow a 'kill code' comprised of the following:
 -First rule of code: Never get caught
 -Second rule of code: Never kill an innocent
 -Other significant rules: Never make a scene, fake emotion and normality to fit in, when taking a personality test always answer the question with the opposite of what you feel, only kill those who the police have been unable to convict.
 Notes: Morgan has shown willingness to deviate from code several times.

Location: A designated 'kill room' is part of Morgan's kill ritual. The killing areas consist of plastic sheets to prevent anything from contaminating the outside with the victim's DNA. The center of the room always contains some form of sturdy table for the victim to lie on during the ritual. Copious amounts of shrink wrap are used to hold the victims securely in place without being able to escape. The room features the inclusion of something pertaining to the victims that Morgan's target has killed - photographs of the victims, bodies, or other reminders.

Appearance: Military inspired-green colored 4-button long sleeved t-shirt, brown cargo pants, lace-up leather boots, dark-colored rubber apron, dark-colored brown gloves, occasionally a visor mask to protect against blood splatter.

Thoughts or methods to kill: Usually Morgan tracks his target and injects them with M99 animal tranquilizer. He then proceeds to kill the victim with one of the following:
 -Bladed weapons, Power tools, Bare hands (Strangulation), Bludgeons, Poison, Electrocution, Suffocation, Firearms, Automobiles
