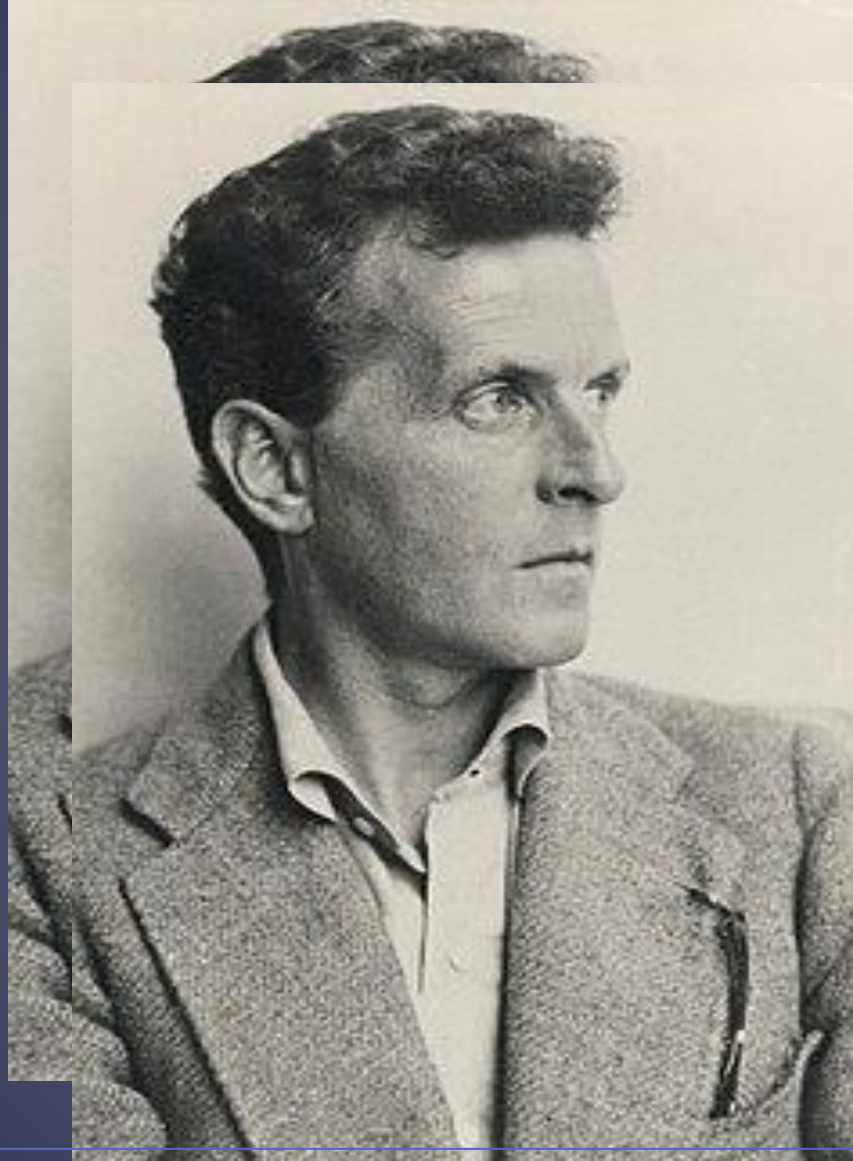

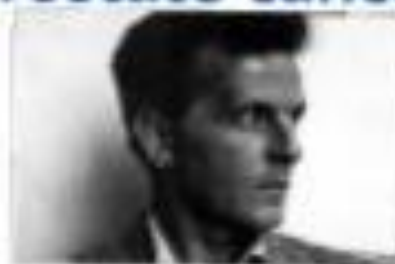
Information about Ludwig Wittgenstein.



Biography

- Born 26 April 1889

- From a wealthy family, youngest of 8 children, privately tutored.
- Worked on the draft of his Tractatus Logico-Philosophicus (1922) in a POW camp
- Became a schoolteacher, gardener and architect when he thought he had solved philosophy's problems.
 - Later became a Professor of Philosophy.
 - Died 29 April 1951 of prostate cancer



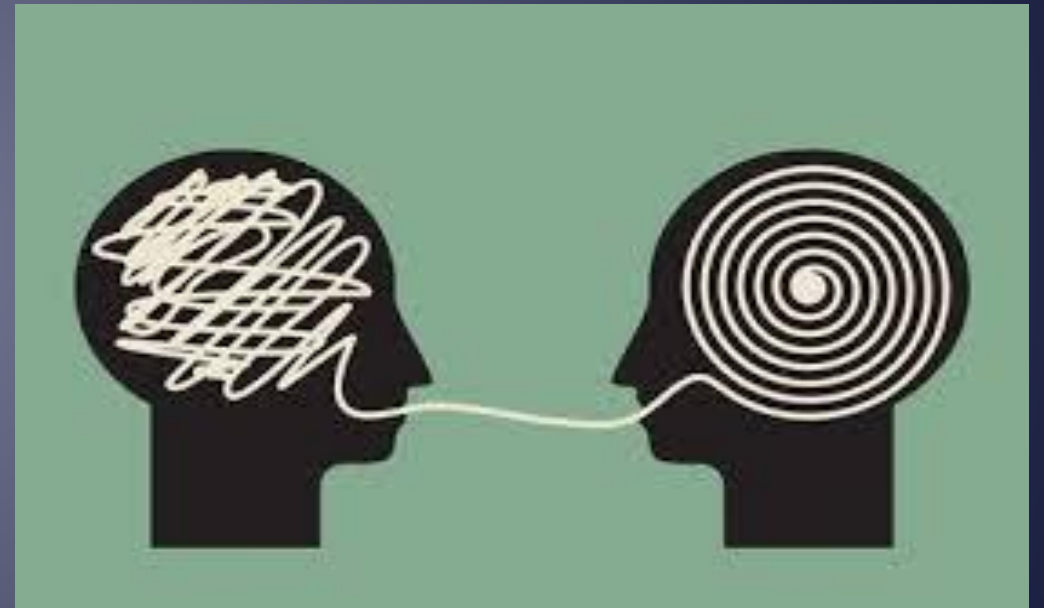
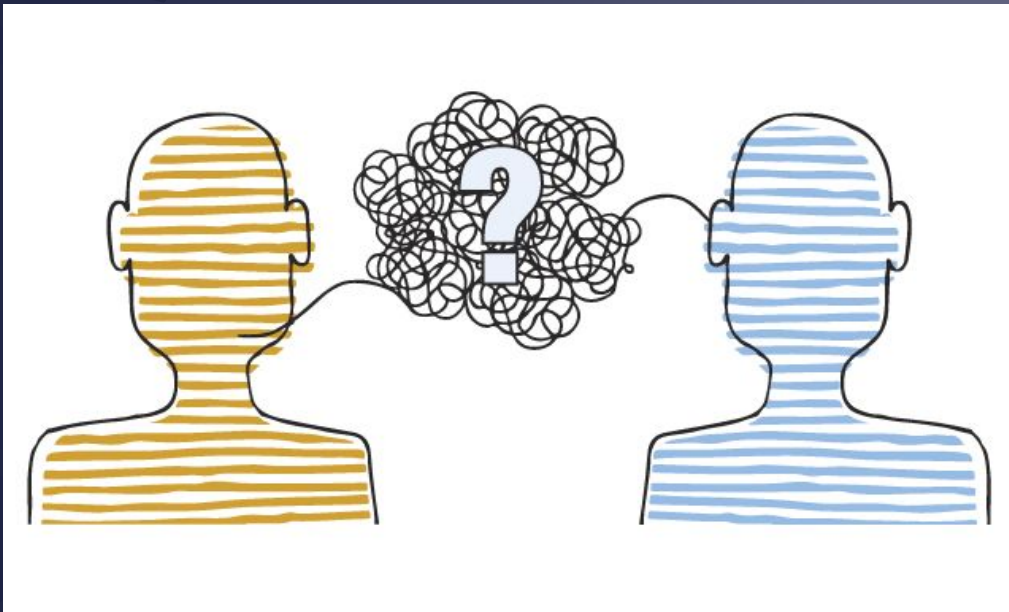

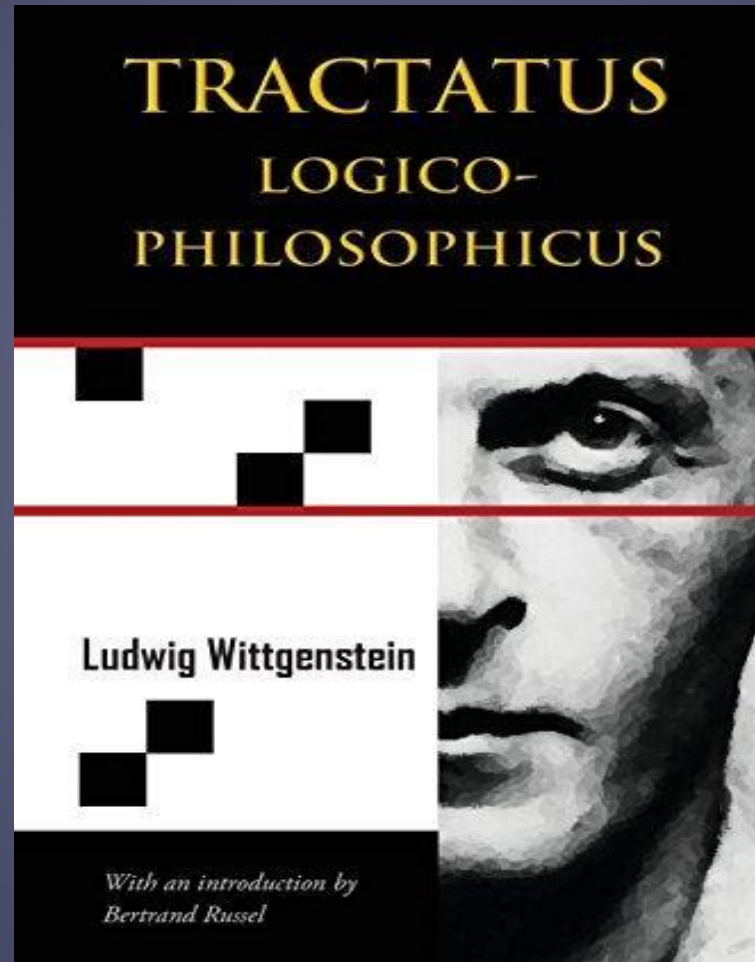


What we mean clearly enough?

Major idea: PICTURE THEORY OF MEANING / LANGUAGE

All meaningful sentences can be pictured in our world; all facts are actual 'pictures' from our world.



Early: Picture Theory (Logical Positivist view)

- Language corresponds to a state of affairs in the world
- Language can only be meaningful if it used in relation to what we see in the world
- Language is a way of representing facts

Language is the communication and representation of ideas which can be pictured. It is restricted beyond this.
