# Artists of the Golden age

Spain has an amazing artistic heritage. The main representatives of the Golden there were artists-followers of Toledo: El Greco and Diego Velasquez. One of the most famous paintings of El Greco Christ heals the Blind.

# Traditions of the Spanish people

1) Bullfights remain popular in Spain. Football is a favorite sport. In the South of the country large audiences gather cockfights.



2) Spaniards are convinced that Breakfast at home-the lot of the poor, so from 10: 00 all the cafes in the cities are crowded with locals.





3) At night, Spanish music and dance performances are held in cafes and bars; Andalusian flamenco Cantos are often played.



# National characteristic of the Spaniards

Customs and traditions. "Paseo" that is, an evening walk around the city to see friends, is an old Spanish tradition, as is its inevitable consequence, "Osio", meaning idle conversation. The Spaniards do it anywhere and at any time.





Hobby. Siesta, the most favorite of all the most favorite activities of the Spaniards. Two hours of sleep after dinner is so Holy that anyone who is on his feet from three to five days is considered a madman.



# Spanish national cuisine

The most common traditional dish of southern Spain is gazpacho (cold soup). It is an ancient dish of the Andalusian Moors. There are more than thirty recipes for gazpacho. Gazpacho is always served cold.





Some regional dishes of the country have become Spanish and traditional. To them, for example, include paella, tortilla (spicy potato casserole), etc.
