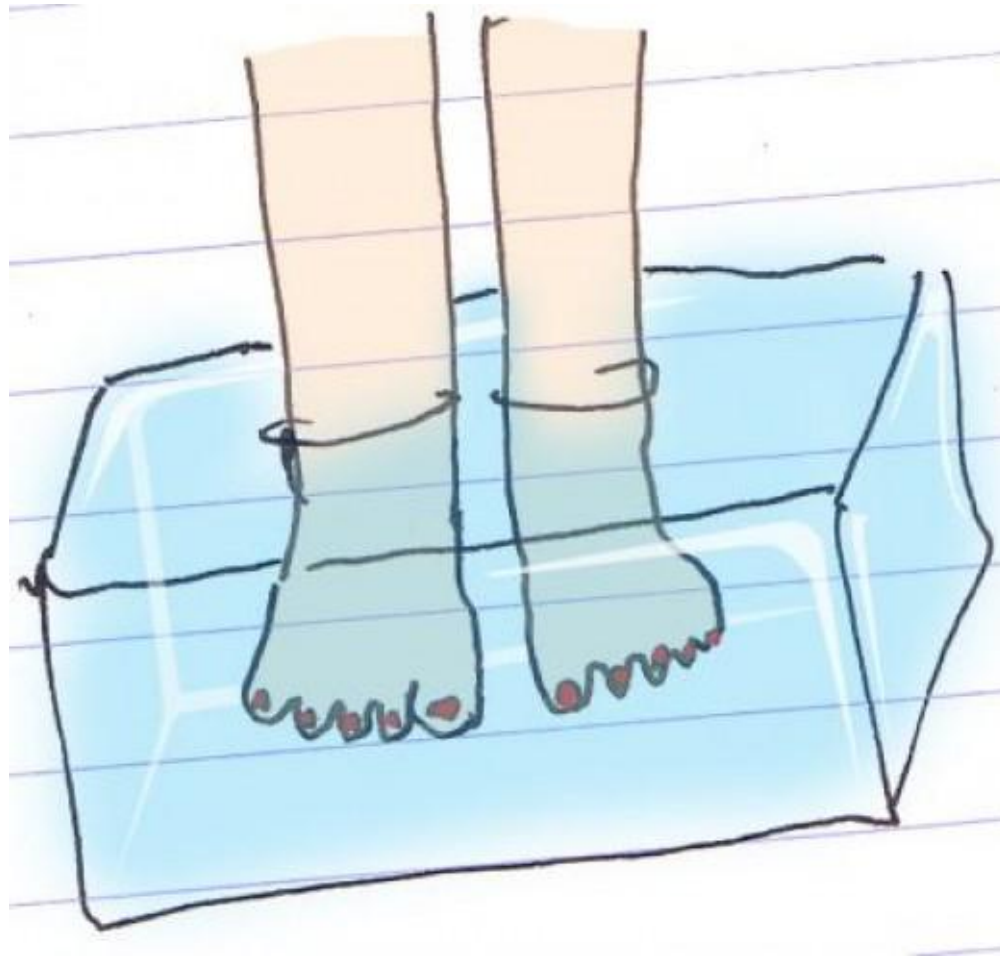

- To hold your horses

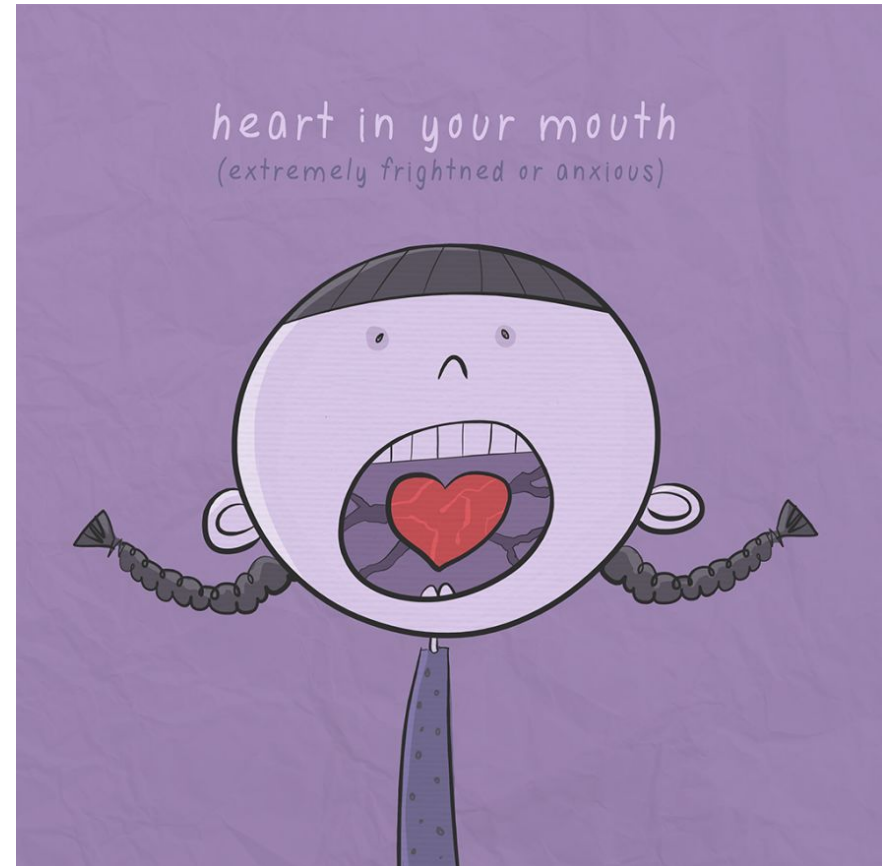

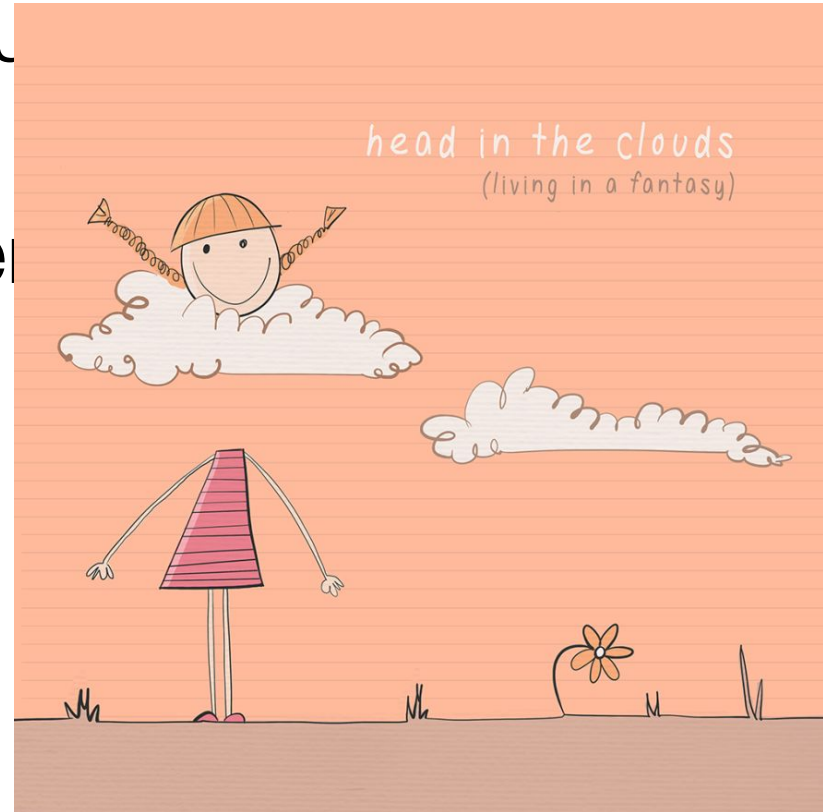
Body parts

- Head in the clouds



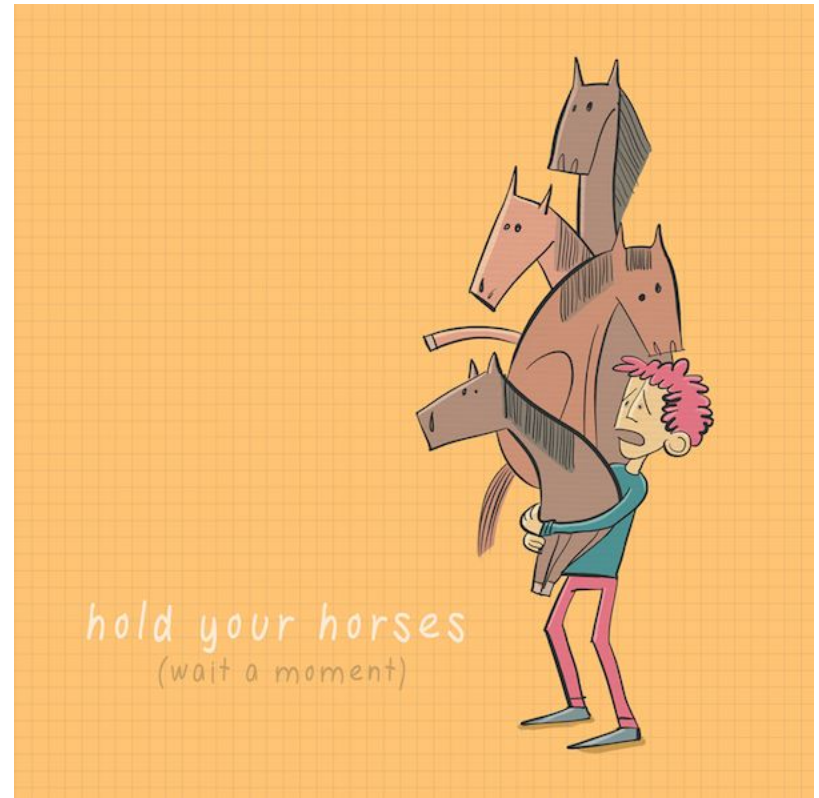
Food related
