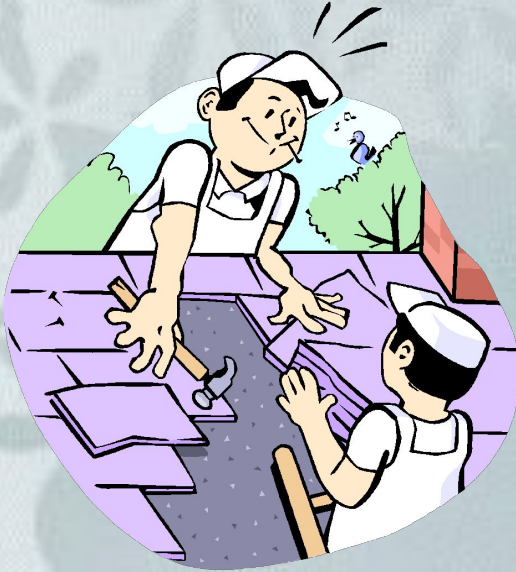


# STUDY THIS EXAMPLE SITUATION:



The roof of Susan's house was damaged in a storm, so she arranged for somebody to repair it. Yesterday a workman came and did the job.

Jill **had the roof repaired** yesterday.

This means: Susan arranged for somebody else to repair the roof. She didn't repair it herself.



## STRUCTURE: TO HAVE SOMETHING DONE

THE VERB « TO HAVE » CAN BE PUT INTO DIFFERENT TENSES DEPENDING ON THE CONTEXT

OBJECT

THE SECOND VERB IS ALWAYS IN THE PAST PARTICIPLE .

She **has**

her hair

**cut** regularly.

She's **having**

her hair

**cut** at the moment.

Look! She's **had**

her hair

**cut**, it looks nice.

She **had**

her hair

**cut** last week.

She **was having**

her hair

**cut** when I arrived.

She'd **had**

her hair

**cut** just before she went on holiday.

She's **going to have**

her hair

**cut** next week.

She's **having**

her hair

**cut** this afternoon.

She'll **have had**

her hair

**cut** by the time I get home.

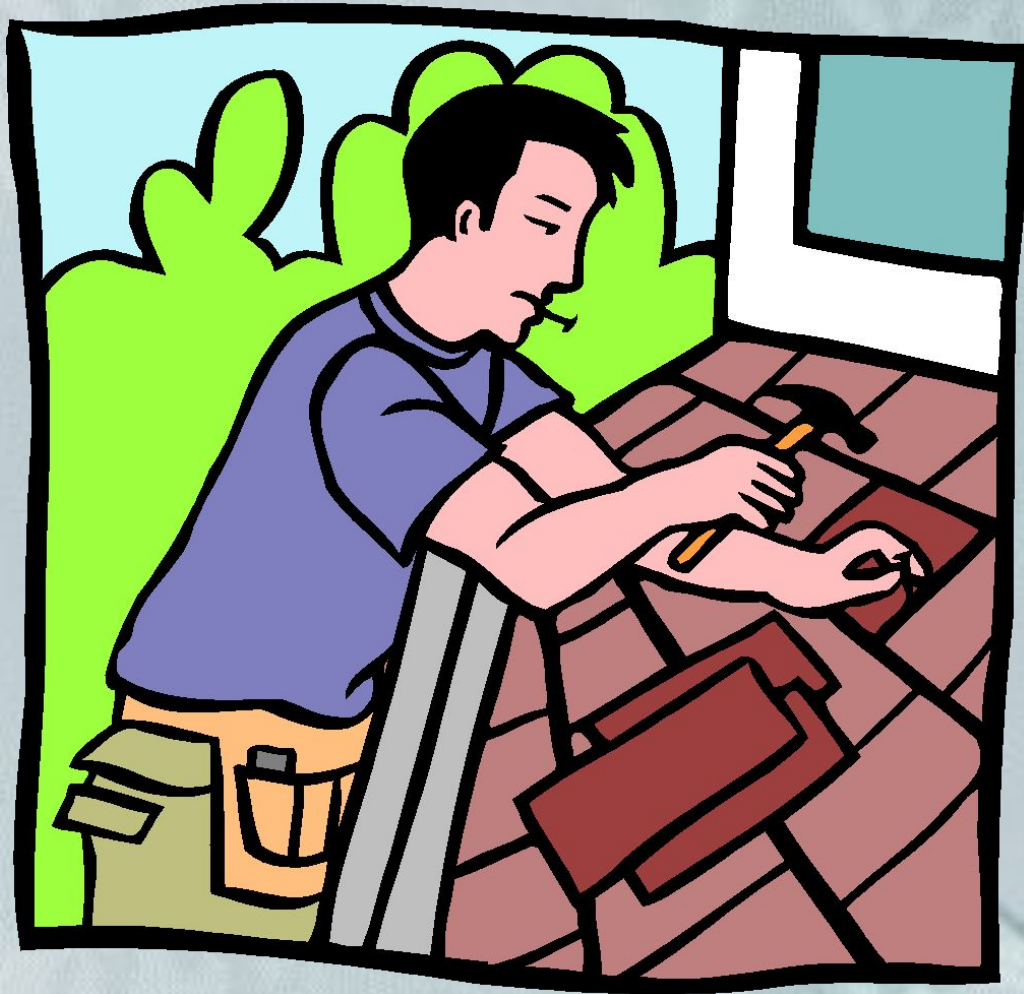

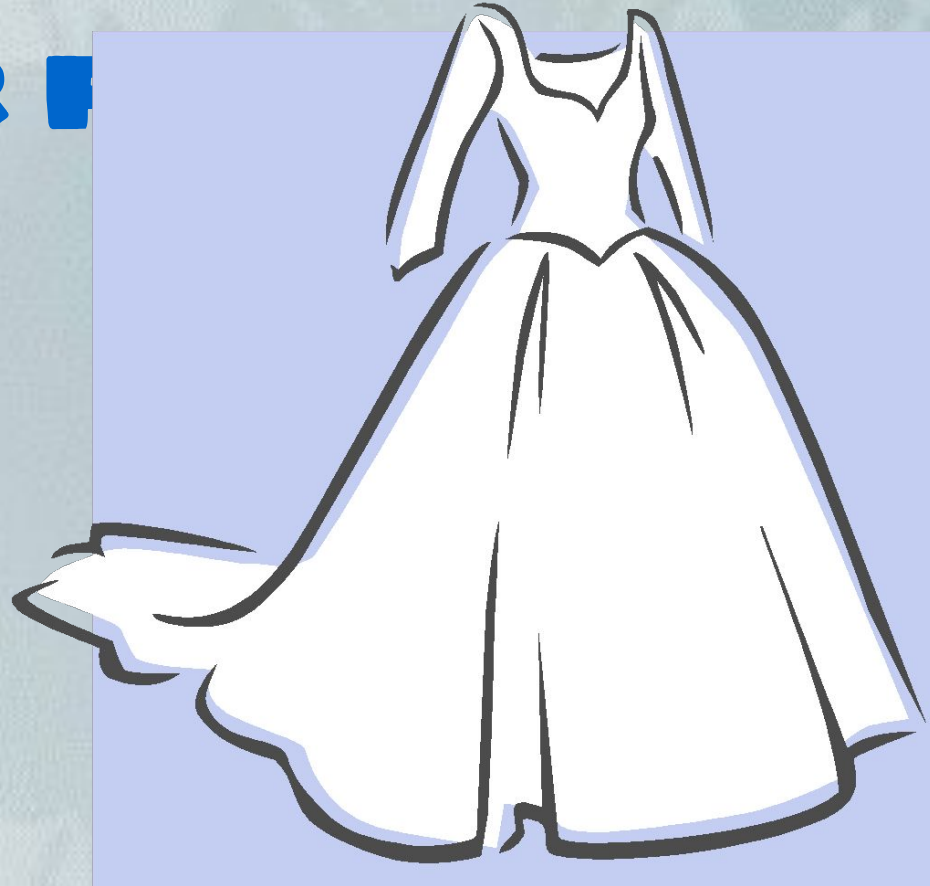

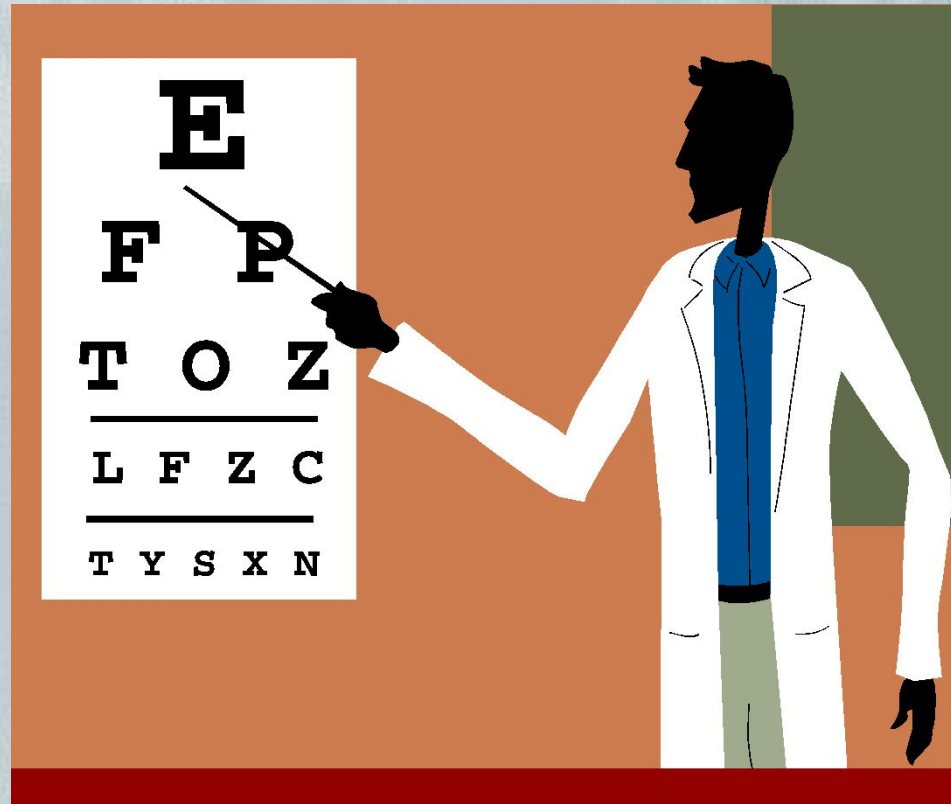
