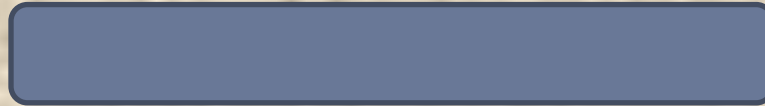
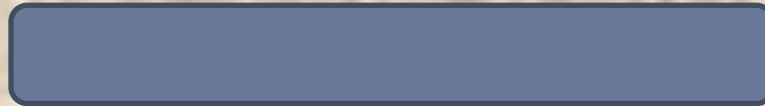
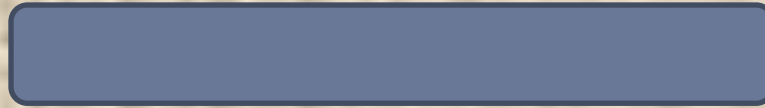

16/1 A typical year in Britain

- School Holidays

The school year always starts at the beginning of September.

A typical year in Great Britain

- There are six terms in the school year and three main holidays:
- the Christmas holidays - two weeks
- the Easter holidays - two weeks
- the summer holidays - six weeks
- Je šesť semestrov v školskom roku a tri hlavné prázdniny:
- Vianočné prázdniny - dva týždne
- Veľkonočné prázdniny - dva týždne
- letné prázdniny - šesť týždňov



A typical year in Britain

- There are also short holidays in October, February and May. These are for one week or ten days.
- Tam sú tiež krátke prázdniny v októbri, februári a máji. Tieto sú 1 týždeň alebo 10 dní.

On Christmas Day (25 December), they open their presents and there is a traditional meal of turkey with vegetables followed by Christmas pudding.



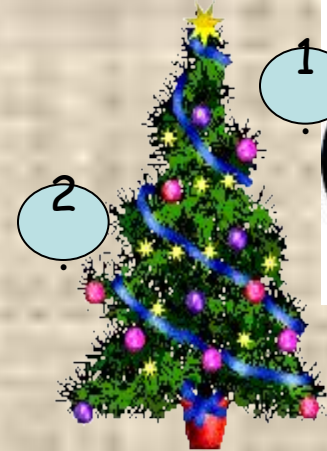
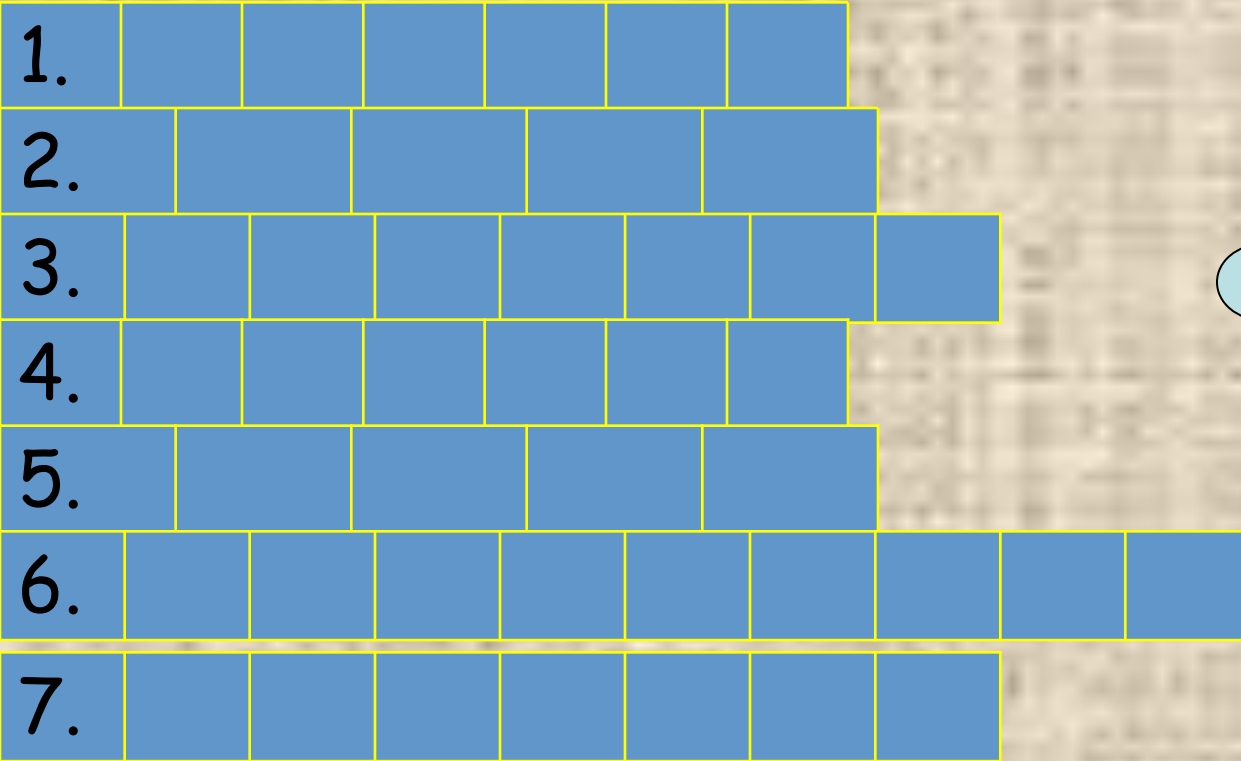


Christmas

The next day (26 December) is a holiday too. We call it Boxing Day. On Boxing Day, people often visit friends or to to sport matches.



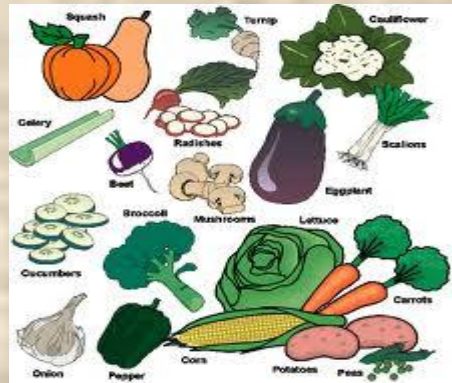

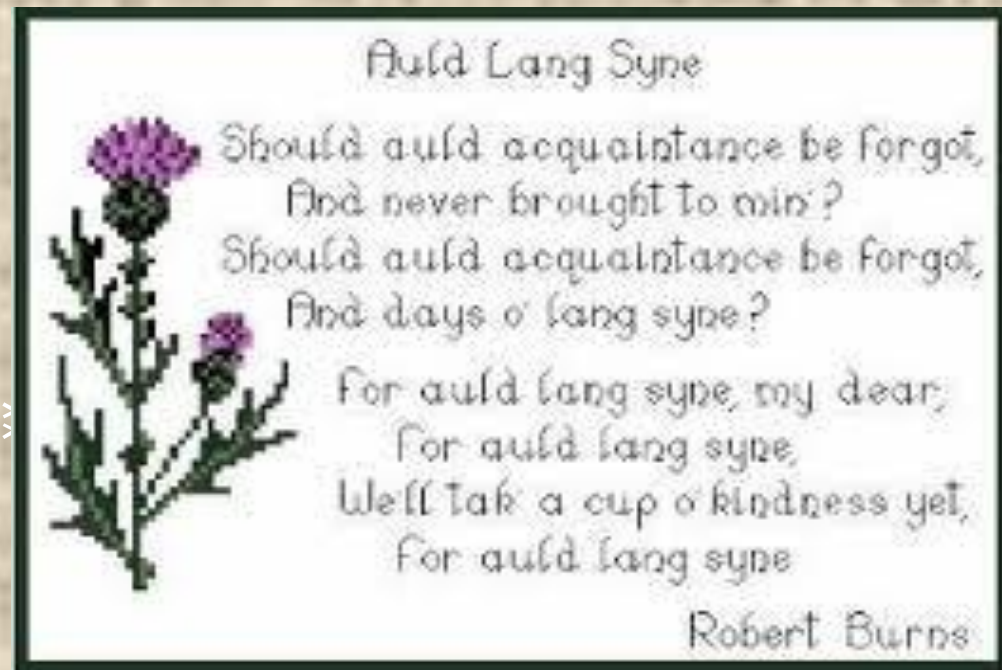
At New Year a lot of people
