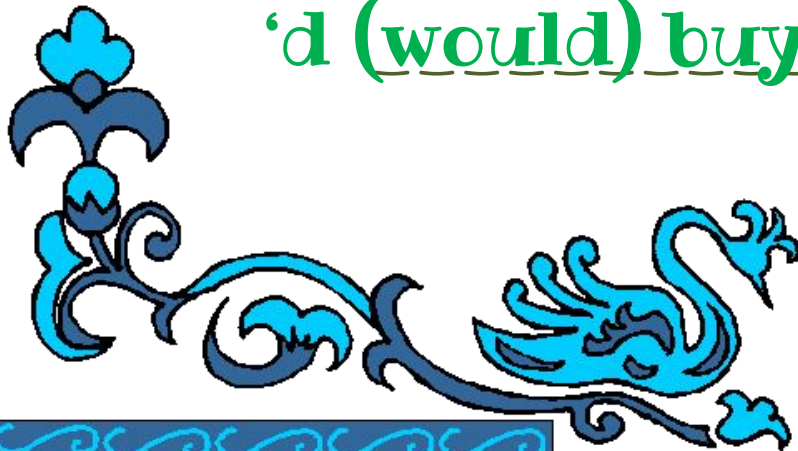

What would you do (you/do) if you lost (lose) your wallet?



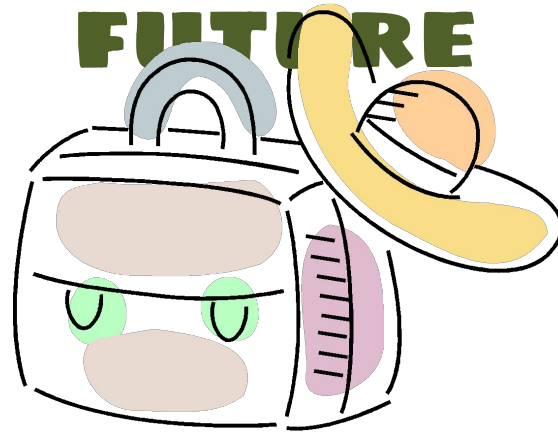
# SECOND CONDITIONAL FOR UNREAL SITUATIONS IN THE PRESENT OR IN THE FUTURE
