Big Ben is the most famous symbol of Great Britain.





A very popular tourist attraction is the London Eye. It is a giant observation wheel.




The 135 metres tall structure was built as part of London's millennium celebrations.

It is a wonderful building with a monument in front of it which is the Queen Victoria Memorial.




It takes fifteen minutes to get from Buckingham Palace to Trafalgar Square, the centre of London.
