

#### **KEEP ON**

= to continue to do something, or to do something again and again

#### **KEEP BACK** = maintain a safe distance



He kept on trying and succeeded in the end. I asked him to stop but he just kept on.



The police told the crowd to keep back from the fire.

#### **KEEP OFF**

= to stop touching or harming someone or something

#### **KEEP UP WITH** = to stay up to date




Please keep off the grass. Keep off the motorway in the morning, there are always traffic jams at that time.



It's hard to keep up with all the latest improvements and breakthroughs in technology nowadays.

#### **KEEP OUT OF** = to not get involved in something






It's not my business. I keep out of their arguments.



### poor

having little money and/or few possessions

#### бедный

Most of the world's poorest countries are in Africa.

not good; being of a very low quality, quantity, or standard

## weak

not physically strong or not strong in character

слабый, безвольный, непрочный



How do you like your tea strong or weak? He's still feeling a bit weak after his operation. The team has a strong attack, but its defence is weak.

## low

below the usual level

#### низкий, невысокий



Temperatures are very low for the time of year. The big supermarket offers the lowest prices in town.

## custom

a habit or tradition

обычай



In my country, it's the custom (for women) to get married in white.

## habit

something that you do regularly, almost without thinking about it

привычка



We have a **habit** of getting up late on Saturday mornings.

### manner

the way in which a person talks and behaves with other people

манера, поведение

She has a somewhat cold, unfriendly manner.

the way something happens or something is done

метод, способ

They dealt with the problem in a very efficient manner.

## lead

to show someone where to go, usually by taking them to a place or by going in front of them

вести, показывать путь



We followed a path that led us up the mountain.

#### pass

to go past something or someone

проходить, проезжать мимо

She passed me this morning in the corridor.

to give something to someone

передавать Could you pass the salt, please?

to succeed at a test or an exam

#### выдержать (экзамен)

I passed my driving test the first time.

## spend

to use money to buy or pay for something

тратить (деньги)

She spends too much money on clothes.



to use time doing something or being somewhere

проводить (время)
