BLOW UP HALL 5050

When guests at the Blow Up Hall 5050 at check-in receive an iPhone. They find their number and open a door with iPhone, that does not have traditional numbers. Each phone has special applications. All the time while the guests are in the hotel, they will be participants in a huge video installation in the lobby, which displays people moving throughout the hotel, excluding rooms, of course.





INNTEL HOTELS AMSTERDAM ZAANDAM

Gizmodo described the Inntel as "the giant house of the Silvanian Family" - a huge world of collectible toys, but we think it great and no doubt all fans of Danish architecture will like it. In fact, the hotel looks like a jumble of several houses in traditional Danish style at each other. The 11-story hotel was designed by Wilfred van Winden (who is an Escher fan), the main architect of the independent WAM studio; The hotel has 160 rooms, a restaurant and a sports hall. Yes, and of course Wi-Fi for free.





MAMA SHELTER, PARIS

Mama Shelter includes designed by Philippe Starck at each room. Everyone has a 24-inch iMac, with control HDTV, audio system, choose movies, order a DVD and, of course, use the Internet, as well as a guide to the hotel. Monitors are mounted in the common dining table, and a digital photo booth will allow each guest to become a participant in a dynamic video installation.





ICON, HONG-KONG

The ICON hotel is not only a superbly functioning hotel, but also a non-commercial venue for student studying in the specialty Hotel and Tourism Management. Hotel belong to the Hong Kong Polytechnic University. In addition to standard accommodation, guests can book one of three more modern rooms. The rooms are notable for the main emphasis placed on the pillow menu, on innovations and design - they include, for example, Cybertecture smart mirrors, which display news, a weather forecast, a list of services offered by the hotel and other information.



BELLEVUE PALACE

Guests receive an iPad tablet, making every table a chef's high-tech desktop Before serving meals at the Bellevue Palace's La Terrasse restaurant. Video broadcasting shows how chef Gregor Zimmerman and his team prepare delicacies roast beef in sesame and ras-el-khanu Malfatti. The chat feature allows restaurant visitors to comment on the cooking process and ask a question like: "Hey, chef! What spices do you use in the sauce?", And the chef will answer for you.





CHICAGO DOWNTOWN AUTOGRAPH COLLECTION

The Chicago Downtown Autograph Collection hotel used the services of Microsoft when equipping conference rooms. As a result they became worthy of the Pentagon. Guests of the hotel can always use the services of technical staff who are able to organize group videoconferencing at first request. The main conference center has a wall consisting of 32 plasma panels. Conference rooms are equipped with high-definition projectors, the studio has the latest gaming and computer equipment. Every hotel room can be transformed into an operational control center for a company.



YOTEL, NYC



If the Yotel hotel's automatic reception desk and white-on-white design remind you of "2001: A Space Odyssey", then Yobot, the robotic baggage claim line, will no doubt be associated with the HAL robot from the same movie. Luggage after registration will be in a box on a special rack, where it will put a huge white manipulator, so that you can safely go for a walk around New York.
