

PHRASAL VERBS

Part 3

UP = ПОВНІСТЮ

TEAR UP

- She tore up all the letters he had sent her.

COUNT UP

to count up to ten — *считать до десяти*

count up to a hundred — *считать до ста*

count up to ten — *считать до десяти*

he has learned to count up to a hundred — *он научился считать до ста*

Sarah can count up to five now.
Сара уже умеет считать до пяти.

Count up all your money and see if you have enough.
Подсчитай все деньги и посмотри, наберётся ли у тебя нужная сумма.

I find I can get off to sleep by trying to count up to 100.
Я думаю, что смогу заснуть, если буду считать до ста.

EAT UP

eat up every grain of rice — *съесть весь рис до последнего зёрнышка*

eat up food — *доесть то, что на тарелке; съесть все*

eat up the fragments — *доесть остатки*

eat up one's food — *доесть то, что на тарелке; съесть всё (что положено)*

eat up your vegetables, there's a good girl! — *будь умницей и доешь овощи!*

eat up, children! — *дети, не оставляйте ничего на тарелке!*

FILL UP

- the ditches had filled up with mud.
- to fill up the tank with oil
- too many spam emails are filling up our inboxes
- reading fills up my evening — *я заполняю вечер чтением*
we must fill up all the buckets we can find — *надо налить воду во все вёдра, которые есть*
all parts of the theatre were quickly filled up — *все места в театре быстро оказались занятыми*

OUT – РІЗНИМ ЛЮДЯМ

HAND OUT

- Would you hand these papers out for me?
- Ralph was handing out drinks.

SHARE OUT

- We had one pizza shared out between us.

ON - ПРОДОВЖУВАТИ

CARRY ON

- *Carry on. You're doing fine.*
- *He moved to London to carry on his work.*
- *For the moment we've been told to carry on as usual.*
- **carry on with:** *Just carry on with what you were doing.*
- **carry on doing something:** *If you carry on spending money like that, you'll end up in debt.*

DRIVE ON

- *We drove on for a little while.*
- *The traffic jam is breaking up, so we can drive on.*

HANG ON/HOLD ON A MINUTE

used for asking someone to wait for a short period of time, especially someone who you are talking to on the telephone
