




### **University of Cambridge:**


Scientific specialties: chemical engineering; computer science; engineering; industrial engineering; mathematics; medicine; natural sciences; veterinary medicine.








# The most famous building in Cambridge is King's College Cathedral

The performance of the Royal College Cathedral Boys' Choir is traditionally televised at Christmas every year.






#### College of St. Nicholas and the Virgin Mary. It is also called Royal.

George Batchelor is professor of applied mathematics.


Stephen Hawking is a professor of theoretical physics and an internationally renowned popularizer of science.



University of Cambridge traditions

The University of Cambridge is one of the most ancient and conservative universities in the world, and any student of this university inevitably becomes part of the centuries-old Cambridge traditions. For example, the worst student was given a symbolic wooden spoon. The last time such a spoon the size of an oar was issued was in 1909. the graduation procedure was solemn, the student also takes an oath in Latin and changes his old robe for a new one, corresponding to the new degree he received.
