- WE ARE INTERESTED IN WHAT HAPPENS, NOT WHO IT IS DONE BY;
- THE SITUATION IS RATHER FORMAL.

HOW TO FORM THE PASSIVE VOICE

TO BE + V₃

SIMPLE PASSIVE

□ PRESENT: **AM/IS/ARE +V₃**

Newspapers ~~are brought~~ in the morning.

□ PAST: **WAS/WERE +V₃**

Two poems were learnt yesterday.

□ FUTURE: **SHALL/WILL BE +V₃**

These letters ~~will be sent~~ tomorrow.

MODAL VERBS + PASSIVE

VOICE

CAN (COULD)
MAY (MIGHT)

MUST

HAVE TO

SHOULD

OUGHT TO

BE + V₃

Such books can't be devoured.

The report must be translated into Russian.

CONTINUOUS PASSIVE

- PRESENT: **AM/IS/ARE + BEING + V₃**

Excuse the mess. The house is being painted.

- PAST: **WAS/WERE + BEING + V₃**

We couldn't get inside. The floor was being washed.

- FUTURE: **-----**

PERFECT PASSIVE

- PRESENT: **HAVE/HAS + BEEN + V₃**

Her latest book has been published recently.

- PAST: **HAD + BEEN + V₃**

All the letters had been typed by yesterday evening.

- FUTURE: **SHALL/WILL HAVE + BEEN + V₃**

The new bill ~~will have been passed~~ by the end of this ^{year}.
