#### To be in the black

- to be rich and wealthy
- to be financially solvent

ex. Our company <u>has</u> <u>been in the black</u> for over three years now.



## Black sheep



 someone who is thought to be a bad person by the rest of their family

ex. My father was the <u>black</u> sheep - he ran away at 16 to become an actor and his parents never forgave him.


#### White lie

a <u>lie</u> that is told in <u>order</u>
to be <u>polite</u> or to <u>stop</u>
someone from being
<u>upset</u> by the<u>truth</u>

ex. She asked if I liked her dress, and of course I told a *white lie*.



### White elephant



 an expensive item that is troublesome or useless

ex. At first, Eve was excited to inherit the farm, but it soon proved to be a <u>white elephant</u> she couldn't afford.



#### White-knuckle

 a person who is made tense by something such as flying or sailing


ex. I'm afraid I'm a white-knuckle sailor, andyou'd all be much happier if I stay on dry land.




#### In black and white

 written down or in print, and therefore official

ex. I want to get the information *in black and white* before I go to the meeting.



#### Black and white



 subject or situation is one in which it is easy to understand what is right and wrong

ex. It's not a simple <u>black</u> and white issue.

#### Black and white

- police; a police car

ex. Call the <u>black and</u> <u>whites</u>. We got trouble here.
