





Will and Be Going To for Predictions

We use 'will' when we want to predict sth or inform smn.

Examples:

She'll be excited to see your gift! I will buy a new smartphone, probably.

We can use 'I think' and 'I don't think' in the sentence with 'will' to make predictions.

Tom will like this, I think.

We use 'be going to' to predict sth and talk about what smn is going to do (intentions).

Examples:

Look at the clouds! **It's going to** rain (not will! – immeadiate action, nearest future)

She's going to hate you for doing this.

4.1 BE GOING TO AND WILL FOR PREDICTIONS (page 35)

be going to and will for predictions

She'll be shocked. = She's going to be shocked.

She won't like it. = She's not going to like it.

I think they'll be late. = I think they're going to be late.

I don't think he'll retire soon. = I don't think he's going to retire soon.

NOTE: We don't use will to make a prediction about something when there is evidence. Instead, we use be going to.

The sky is dark. It's going to rain. NOT The sky is dark. It'll rain.



Will for sudden predictions, Present Continuous for Future plans

We use 'will' for sth we decide in the moment of speaking. Example:

She's sick. – I'll visit her and bring some oranges then.

We use be+Ving for something that is already arranged in the future.

Example:

We're having a party this Saturday. You're also invited.


