do – redo делать – переделать

Hollywood studios often remake foreign films.

### mis-

#### **Meanings**:

- bad / badly
- wrong / wrongly

understand - misunderstand

hear - mishear

behave - misbehave

inform - misinform

#### **Meanings**:


- too much

lock - unlock запереть - отпереть

like – dislike нравиться – не нравиться

agree - disagree согласиться - не согласиться

appear - disappear появиться - исчезнуть

plug in - unplug включать в сеть - отключить от сети

#### **RUN AWAY**


= when a child or teenager leaves home because of problems with the family



She ran away from home when she was just 15.

#### **RUN THROUGH**

= to rehearse a play, performance, song, or presentation



I'd like to run through the presentation one more time to make sure everything's perfect.

#### **RUN OUT OF**

= to use all of something so that there is none left



I've nearly run out of money.

#### **RUN OVER**

= to hit with a vehicle (car, train, truck), to knock down



She's upset because she ran over a cat while driving home from work.

#### **RUN INTO**

= to meet by accident





I ran into my boss at the supermarket.

### Words often confused





#### be set

If a story, film, etc. is set in a particular time or place, the action in it happens in that time or place.



"West Side Story" is set in New York City in the late 1950s.

#### be situated

to be in a particular place



The school is situated near the park.

### to play

to perform a particular character in a theatrical performance or a film



In the movie version, he played the hero. Early in her career she played Ophelia.

#### to star

to be the main actor in a film, play, or other show



Johnny Depp starred in more than thirty films. Will Smith has starred in "I Am Legend".

### to take a picture / photo

to point a camera at an object and press the shutter button



I took a photo of the recent solar eclipse. He takes photos for a living.

### to make a picture


to draw or perhaps print a picture, not that you just take a photo with your camera

#### **Compare:**

I took a picture of my brother.

=

I photographed him.





I made a picture of my brother.

=

I drew a picture of him.

### presentation

a speech or talk in which a new product, idea, or piece of work is shown and explained to the audience



Presentation is important if you want people to buy your products.

### performance

an act of presenting a play, concert, or other form of entertainment



A new performance scored a great success.

### exhibit (n)

an object or collection of objects on public display in an art gallery or museum or at a trade fair



Let's go to see the new dinosaur exhibit. The museum has a fascinating collection of exhibits.

### exhibition (n)

an event at which objects such as paintings are shown to the public; a situation in which someone shows a particular skill or quality to the public



The photographs will be on exhibition until the end of the month.

There's a new exhibition of sculpture on at the city gallery.
