- I understand that I have to learn English in a proper way and I try to do it. I know that it is not easy but interesting.

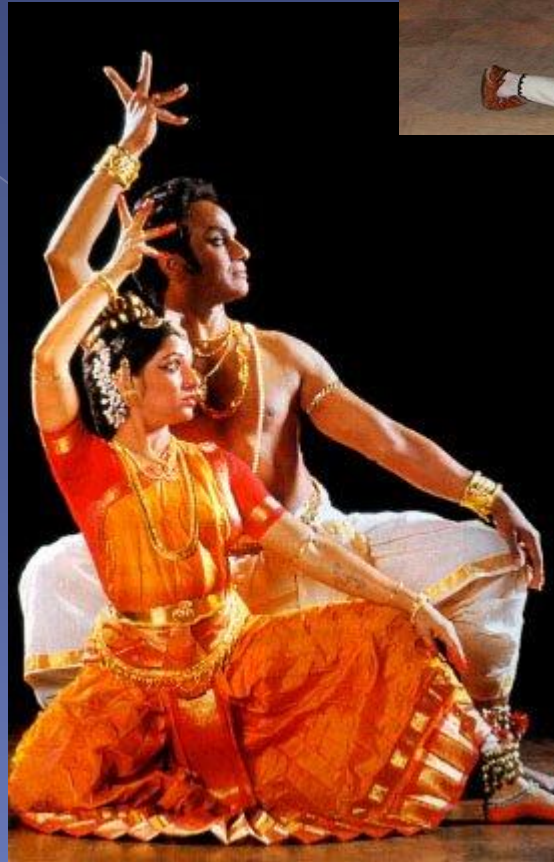

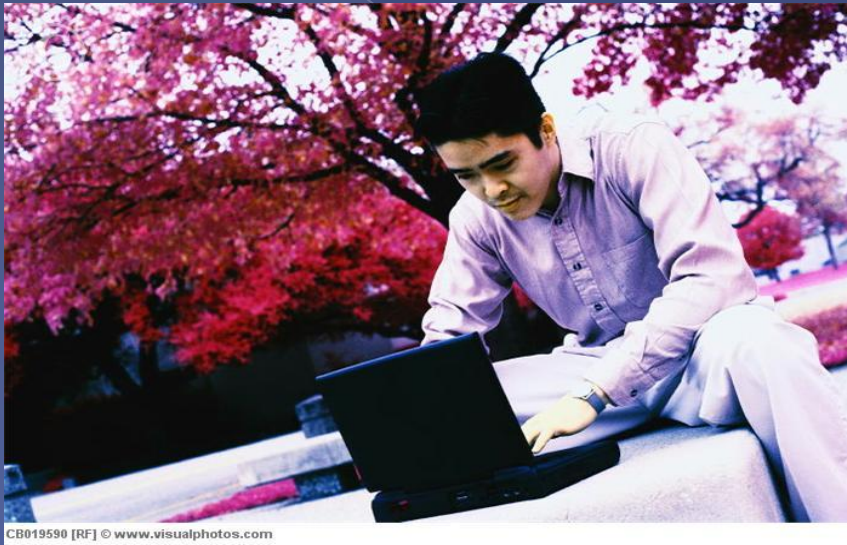

- You can receive job of your dream, earn more money and organize your future. Learning to speak foreign languages may be the best thing you can do to improve your life and open new doors.



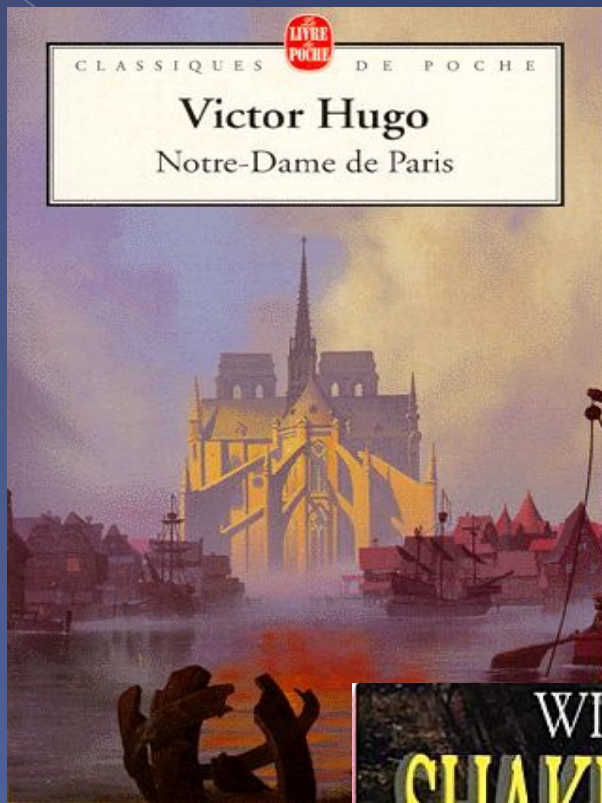
We often listen to foreign music. We just feel the rhythm, but do not know what they sing.



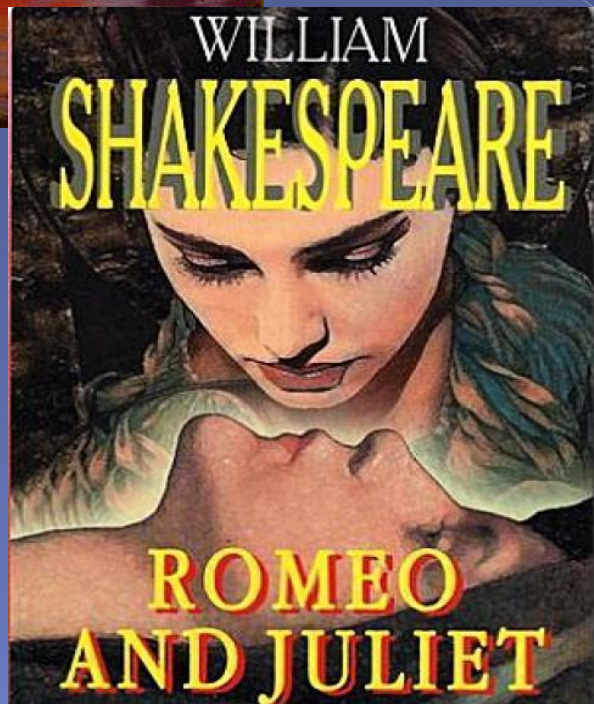
*If we know foreign languages, music is much better as you can understand the words.*
